RE: **NJDEP Vehicle Registration Renewals**  
**New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP)**  
**VEHICLE DECAL REGISTRATION and A-901 LICENSING REQUIREMENT.**

**In compliance with the NJDEP, the CMCMUA advises all solid waste customers that their required NJDEP registration renewals must be completed **ONLINE** beginning March 1, 2011 through May 30, 2011. Additional Information on how to renew online is available on the home page of the CMCMUA's website at [www.cmcmua.com](http://www.cmcmua.com). In addition, all documents and certifications related to the DEP Vehicle Registration renewal must be kept up-to-date and on file at your office.**

By July 1, 2011, all solid waste customers must have a current year NJDEP registration (2011-2013) and display the current year NJDEP decal, with an expiration date of June 30, 2013, on their vehicles or be denied access to the CMCMUA solid waste facilities. As per N.J.A.C 7:26-3.1, NJDEP vehicle registration is required by the NJDEP for all solid waste haulers disposing of waste at solid waste facilities in New Jersey. The CMCMUA Sanitary Landfill and Transfer Station, as permitted NJDEP Solid Waste facilities, must comply with NJDEP regulations or be subject to fines.

**Please carefully read the following information to avoid financial penalties that may be issued by the NJDEP or the Cape May County Health Department.**

➤ **NJDEP VEHICLE DECAL REGISTRATION REQUIREMENT**

Per N.J.A.C. 7: 26-3.1: **All commercially registered vehicles** utilizing the CMCMUA Sanitary Landfill working face and Convenience Areas and/or the CMCMUA Transfer Station Bays and Convenience Areas and disposing of Solid Waste (Types 10, 13, 13C, 23, 25, 27 & 27A) **generated through the nature of their business or hauling solid waste for hire** must have their vehicles registered with the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and display the NJDEP decal on the driver's side of their vehicle. N.J.A.C 7:26-3.4(h) requires that all registrants display in letters and numbers at least three inches in height the NJDEP number, **the company/trade name and the capacity of the vehicle**. This information must be permanently displayed by the registrant on the driver's side of each registered solid waste vehicle and container in contrasting colors to be visible to the operator of the solid waste facility. Using letters and numbers at least three inches in height, **paint or affix the letters "NJDEP"**, your unique NJDEP number and the carrying capacity of your vehicle or container, then **permanently affix the NJDEP decal just below this information to a clean surface**. All this information must be displayed on the Driver's Side of the vehicle (both sides of container).

➤ Further, all commercially registered vehicles hauling solid waste that are in excess of **9,000 lbs. gross vehicle weight** must be registered with the NJDEP and are subject to the same placard requirements specified under N.J.A.C. 7:26-3.4(h) as those registrants who haul solid waste for hire or generate waste through the nature of their business.

➤ **A-901 LICENSING REQUIREMENT**

The NJDEP requires all haulers **in the business of hauling solid waste for hire** to obtain A-901 licensing, as well as, obtaining NJDEP Vehicle Decal Registration for their vehicles. Information on A-901 licensing may be obtained by contacting the NJDEP at (609) 292-6018.

➤ **"Vehicles"** for the purpose of this Advisory include single unit vehicles (i.e.: dump trucks, compactors, pickup trucks, vans, etc.) cabs, containers and trailers.

Presently the biennial (2 year) fee for NJDEP VEHICLE DECAL REGISTRATION is as follows:

Single unit vehicle-\$100.00; Trailer-\$60.00; Cab-\$40.00; Container-\$60.00;

Decals issued during the 2011 registration period will be effective July 1, 2011 and expire June 30, 2013.

If you are not currently registered with the NJDEP and you fall into the above category requiring NJDEP registration and vehicle decals, you **must** contact the **NJDEP at (609) 292-7081 or Jeff Unger of the Cumberland County Health Department at (856) 327-7602** for further assistance.

**Customers who do not comply with N.J.A.C. regulations concerning Solid Waste vehicle registration as outlined above are prohibited from utilizing CMCMUA Solid Waste Facilities.**
