

Recycling Requirements

Residents and businesses must separate recyclables from trash.

Haulers must collect recyclables separately from trash.

The Recycling Act, P.L. 1987, c.102, established the statutory framework for mandatory statewide recycling. Municipal ordinances detail the local requirements for separation and set-out of recyclables by residents and businesses.

Pursuant to NJDEP Recycling Rules, N.J.S.A. 13:1E-99.16(d) The governing body of a municipality may exempt persons occupying commercial premises for source separation requirements of the ordinance if those persons have otherwise provided for the recycling of designated recyclables. To be eligible for an exemption, a commercial waste generator must receive the prior written approval of the municipality and must annually provide written documentation to the municipality of the total number of tons recycled.

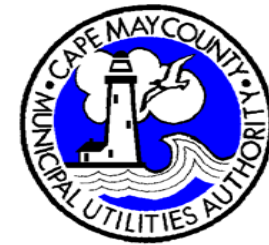

Appoint a Recycling Coordinator

You or someone in your business:

- should know where to obtain information about recycling,
- should know who to call when recyclables are not picked up on schedule,
- should be responsible for training new employees; and
- should report tons recycled annually to your municipality if your business is not part of the municipal collection program.

MANDATORY DESIGNATED RECYCLABLES

Mixed paper including:

- Cardboard,
- Office Paper & Brochures,
- Newspaper & Magazines,
- Bulk Mail & Shredded Paper

Cans and Bottles including:

- Glass Bottles,
- Plastic Bottles with a ♻️ through ♻️ imprinted on the bottom,
- Aluminum Cans,
- Steel (tin) Cans.

How to Recycle

COLLECTION IN YOUR MOTEL

If chamber maids remove trash from rooms...

Guests should sort recyclables from trash. Most will cooperate if you make it easy. Make sure you have instructions on recycling in the room. Next to the trash can, place a container, labeled for "Cans and Bottles." You may also provide a container labeled "Recyclable Paper" or ask guests to leave paper on a bureau or desk. Be sure that chamber maids have separate bags or containers for recyclables on their cleaning cart. Containers or dumpsters in the storage area should be clearly marked for recyclables or trash.

If your guests remove trash from rooms....

In each room provide instructions on how to recycle and be sure containers in rooms and drop-off area are clearly labeled for trash or recycling.

COLLECTION FROM YOUR MOTEL

Call your municipality to find out about collection of recyclables. Most municipalities offer free curbside collection to businesses.

If municipal collection is not an option in your location or is not sufficient for your needs, contact a private hauler. NOTE: Haulers must transport recyclables separately from trash.

You can self-haul recyclables to the CMCMUA Transfer Station and Landfill. Paper & Corrugated; Cans & Bottles are accepted FREE.
