

## Recycling Requirements

**Residents and businesses must separate recyclables from trash.**

**Haulers must collect recyclables separately from trash.**

The Recycling Act, P.L. 1987, c.102, established the statutory framework for mandatory statewide recycling. Municipal ordinances detail the local requirements for separation and set-out of recyclables by residents and businesses.

Pursuant to NJDEP Recycling Rules, N.J.S.A. 13:1E-99.16(d) The governing body of a municipality may exempt persons occupying commercial premises from source separation requirements of the ordinance if those persons have otherwise provided for the recycling of designated recyclables. To be eligible for an exemption, a commercial waste generator must receive the prior written approval of the municipality and must annually provide written documentation to the municipality of the total number of tons recycled.

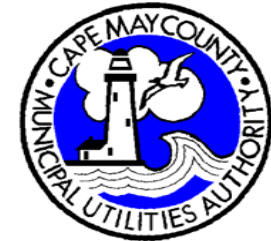

## WHAT AND HOW TO RECYCLE



### Appoint a Recycling Coordinator

You or someone in your business:

- should know where to obtain information about recycling;
- should know who to call when recyclables are not picked up on schedule;
- should be responsible for training new employees;
- should report tons recycled annually to your municipality if your business is not part of the municipal collection program; and
- should know how to recycle additional mandatory materials.

## What to Recycle

### MANDATORY RECYCLABLES

#### Mixed paper including:

- Cardboard
- Office Paper & Brochures
- Newspaper & Magazines
- Bulk Mail & Shredded Paper

#### Cans and Bottles including:

- Glass Bottles
- Plastic Bottles with a ♻️ through ♻️ imprinted on the bottom
- Aluminum Cans
- Steel (tin) Cans

Cooking grease: Call a private vendor.

## How to Recycle

### COLLECTION IN YOUR RESTAURANT

**Corrugated** boxes will be the bulk of the paper generated. Flattened or compacted boxes can be stored inside or outside in a shed or dumpster. Other recyclable **paper**, including see through plastic bags of shredded paper, can be stored in a container or added to the dumpster. Weather protection is needed if paper/boxes are stored outside.

**Cans and bottles** are best collected in appropriately sized plastic containers placed for convenient use by kitchen workers and bar tenders. As needed, employees should empty individual containers into large set-out containers or into a dumpster. Containers of cans and bottles may be stored outside.

Check with your municipality regarding requirement for lids on set-out containers. If you generate more than six 30 gal containers, consider purchase or rental of a dumpster.

### COLLECTION FROM YOUR RESTAURANT

Call your municipality to find out about collection of recyclables. Most municipalities offer free curbside collection to businesses.

If municipal collection is not an option in your location or not sufficient for your needs, contact a private hauler. Recyclables and trash must be hauled separately.

You can self-haul recyclables to the CMCMUA Transfer Station and Landfill. Cans and Bottles, Paper and Corrugated are accepted FREE.
