

Recycling Requirements

Residents and businesses must separate recyclables from trash.

Haulers must collect recyclables separately from trash.

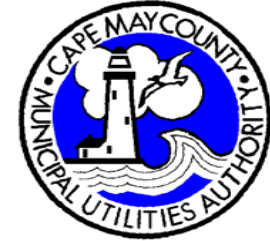
The Recycling Act, P.L. 1987, c.102, established the statutory framework for mandatory statewide recycling. Municipal ordinances detail the local requirements for separation and set-out of recyclables by residents and businesses.

Pursuant to NJDEP Recycling Rules, N.J.S.A. 13:1E-99.16(d) The governing body of a municipality may exempt persons occupying commercial premises for source separation requirements of the ordinance if those persons have otherwise provided for the recycling of designated recyclables. To be eligible for an exemption, a commercial waste generator must receive the prior written approval of the municipality and must annually provide written documentation to the municipality of the total number of tons recycled.

WHAT AND HOW TO RECYCLE



Appoint a Recycling Coordinator

You or someone in your business:

- should know where to obtain information about recycling;
- should know who to call when recyclables are not picked up on schedule;
- should be responsible for training new employees;
- should report tons recycled annually to your municipality if your business is not part of the municipal collection program; and
- should know how to find out about recycling additional mandatory materials.

What to Recycle

MANDATORY DESIGNATED RECYCLABLES

Mixed paper including:

- Cardboard
- Office Paper & Brochures
- Newspaper & Magazines
- Bulk Mail & Shredded Paper (shredded paper may be placed in a see-through plastic bag; add bag to mixed paper)

Cans and Bottles including:

- Glass Bottles
- Plastic Bottles with a ♻️ through ♻️ imprinted on the bottom
- Aluminum Cans
- Steel (tin) Cans

How to Recycle

COLLECTION IN YOUR STORE

Corrugated... Employees should separate plastic and other non-paper packing materials from OCC; if packing material cannot be reused, it should be placed in the trash. OCC should be flattened, bundled or compacted. If OCC is stored outside, weather protection is needed. Wet OCC can be recycled but, soggy material is hard to handle. Containers, dumpsters or the inside storage area should be clearly marked for recyclable OCC. **Paper...** Each employee that generates paper should have their own desk-top folder, under-desk box or container. Consider asking employees to empty their paper recycling in into a central storage container. **Paper and corrugated can be stored together for collection of mixed paper.** Place shredded paper in a clear plastic bag; add to mixed paper. **Cans and Bottles...** Commingled cans and bottles can be stored and set out in a 20 or 32 gallon labeled container.

COLLECTION FROM YOUR STORE

Call your municipality to find out about collection of recyclables. Most municipalities offer free curbside collection to businesses.

If municipal collection is not an option in your location or is not sufficient for your needs, contact a private hauler. NOTE: Haulers must transport recyclables separately from trash.

You can self-haul recyclables to the CMCMUA Transfer Station or Landfill. Commingled Cans & Bottles and Mixed Paper are accepted FREE.
