Paper Products including newspaper (with inserts), magazines, office paper, junk mail, telephone and paperback books, corrugated, Kraft grocery bags and chipboard\*\* (such as dry food boxes with liners removed, pizza boxes and powdered detergent boxes).
NO shredded paper.

Curbside collection provided by municipality. Delivered to the CMCMUA Intermediate Processing Facility or Transfer Station at no charge for participating municipalities.<sup>2</sup>

Food & Beverage Glass Containers including clear, green and brown food, beverage bottles.<sup>1</sup> Curbside collection provided by municipality. Delivered to the CMCMUA Intermediate Processing Facility or Transfer Station at no charge for participating municipalities.<sup>2</sup>

Food & Beverage Metal Containers including aluminum, bi-metal and steel (tin) food, beverage. 1 Curbside collection provided by municipality. Delivered to the CMCMUA Intermediate Processing Facility or Transfer Station at no charge for participating municipalities.<sup>2</sup>

Plastic Bottles, Jugs and Jars including food and beverage bottles, health, beauty and cleaning products. 2 1/2 gallons or less in size.<sup>2</sup> Excludes automotive fluid, chemical and other jugs which contained hazardous products.<sup>1</sup> Curbside collection provided by municipality. Delivered to the CMCMUA Intermediate Processing Facility or Transfer Station at no charge for participating municipalities.<sup>2</sup>

Non-Bottle Rigid Plastics includes all hard plastics (2 1/2) gallons in size or less, regardless of color, that are not a bottle, jug or jar, excluding chemical/hazardous product containers.<sup>1</sup>

Curbside collection provided by municipality. Delivered to the CMCMUA Intermediate Processing Facility or Transfer Station at no charge for participating municipalities.<sup>2</sup>

° Leaves

Delivered to leaf composting area at the CMCMUA Landfill at nominal fee to offset operating costs. May be delivered to approved municipal or multi-municipal compost facilities or approved agricultural applications. Some municipalities provide curbside collection.

° Grass Clippings

"Cut It & Leave It" or backyard composting are the preferred disposition method. May be delivered to the leaf composting area at the CMCMUA Landfill at nominal fee to offset operating costs. May be delivered to approved municipal or multimunicipal compost facilities. Some municipalities provide curbside collection.

Brush, Tree Branches, Tree Stumps, and Christmas Trees including all sizes of vegetative or land clearing wastes.

Delivered to CMCMUA "Class B" Recycling Center located at the CMCMUA Landfill. Fee charged to offset operating expenses. Each municipality may choose an alternate method of disposition, such as chipping or use of Christmas Trees for dune stabilization; however, any alternative must produce a material which is recycled. Some municipalities provide curbside collection.
