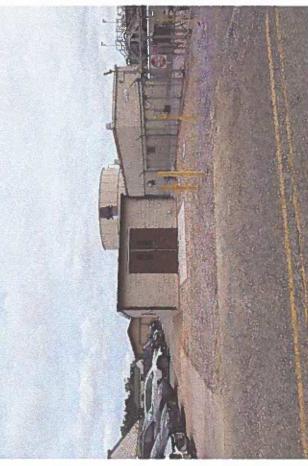

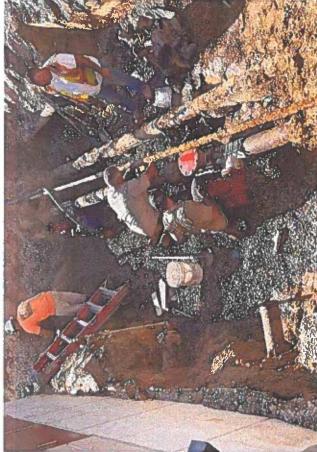

WHEREAS, copies of the proposed "CMCMUA User Charge System, Rate Setting Report, Wastewater Management Program User Charges Effective January 1, 2024 (Proposed)", were available to the public for inspection at the principal office of each Participant, the Lower Township and Middle Township branches of the Cape May County Library, the office of the Board of County Commissioners, the office of the Authority and on the Authority's website from September 12, 2023 through and including October 4, 2023; and,

WHEREAS, notice of the availability of the proposed "CMCMUA User Charge System, Rate Setting Report, Wastewater Management Program User Charges Effective January 1, 2023 (Proposed)", and the designated time and place of a Public Hearing was published in the official newspapers of the Authority, The Press of Atlantic City and the Daily Journal, both on September 12, 2023, respectively; and,

WHEREAS, the Public Hearing explaining the nature of the user charges and specific service charges, as set forth in the aforementioned Rate Setting Report, was held by the Authority on October 4, 2023; and,

WHEREAS, a record of the Public Hearing was made and a transcript will be available upon request to interested parties at a reasonable fee.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Cape May County Municipal Utilities Authority, a body corporate and politic of the State of New Jersey as follows:

- The methodology and system of charges as set forth by the Cape May County Municipal Utilities Authority in its report entitled "CMCMUA User Charge System, Rate Setting Report, Wastewater Management Program User Charges Effective January 1, 2024 (Proposed)", is hereby found to comply with the terms of the Service Agreement between the Cape May County Municipal Utilities Authority and the various Participants and is adopted by the Cape May County Municipal Utilities Authority.
- 2. Said system of charges shall be the basis for charging all Participants who deliver wastewater into the Authority's Regional System.

- 3. The user charges set forth in the aforementioned Rate Setting Report, effective January 1, 2024, are specifically adopted and shall be the basis for billing the services provided to the City of Ocean City, the City of Cape May, the Borough of West Cape May, the Borough of Cape May Point, the Borough of Stone Harbor, the Borough of Avalon, the City of Sea Isle City, the Township of Middle, the County of Cape May (Crest Haven Complex), the City of North Wildwood, the City of Wildwood, the Borough of Wildwood Crest, the Borough of West Wildwood, the Township of Lower Municipal Utilities Authority (Shawcrest area of Lower Township), the New Jersey-American Water Company, the New Jersey Turnpike Authority, and any other users of the services provided by the Cape May County Municipal Utilities Authority, effective January 1, 2024.

I. INTRODUCTION

I have reviewed the documents provided regarding the bid submission with respect to the contract MISC-44-23, Inspection, OEM Maintenance and Equipment Repair Services at the Intermediate Processing Facility on behalf of the Cape May County Municipal Utilities Authority ("CMCMUA" and/or "Authority"). The CMCMUA received one (1) bid for this Contract. The sole bid was received on Tuesday, September 19, 2023, at 2:00 p.m. as follows:

Vendor	<u>Total Amount Bid</u>
1. Advanced Equipment Sales	\$228,964.00
Engineer's Estimate	<u>\$230,000.00</u>

II. FACTUAL ANALYSIS

The bid specifications sought bids for the furnishing of all necessary labor, supervision, equipment, tools and/or materials for inspection, OEM maintenance and miscellaneous repairs of the processing equipment at the Authority's Intermediate Processing Facility. The bid contains three (3) parts. Part 1 consist of the inspection and OEM maintenance services of the existing IPF processing equipment. Part 2 consists of the repairs to the processing equipment that are recommended by the Contractor as a result of the Part 1 work, upon approval from the Authority. Part 3 is for the continued inspection, OEM maintenance and repair services for the existing processing equipment that may be necessary on an as-needed basis. See Bid Specifications Section IV(1.0), Technical Specifications, General.

The apparent low bid was submitted by Advances Design and Control Corp. d/b/a Advanced Equipment Sales ("Advanced Equipment"). Upon review of the bid submitted by Advanced Equipment it was uncovered that the bidder did not submit Insurance Information or Affirmative Action Information within their original bid package. However, the bid specifications provide that the Insurance Information and Affirmative Action Information must be submitted prior to the contract being executed. See Bid Specifications, Section II(XI), General Instruction to Bidders, Statutory and Other Requirements, Mandatory Affirmative Action Certification; See Bid Specifications, Section III, Specific Instructions to Bidders, Insurance Requirements. As such, there are no defects in the bid submitted by Advanced Equipment from a legal perspective.

The bid was further reviewed from a technical perspective by Mr. John Conturo, Solid Waste Program Manager on behalf of the Authority. Following his review, via correspondence dated September 21, 2023, Mr. Conturo opined that the bid submitted by Advanced Equipment complied with the technical specifications and thereafter recommended the award of the contract to Advanced Equipment.

III. LEGAL ANAYLSIS

The Local Public Contracts Law, <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:11-1 et seq. regulates bidding on Contracts of public entities in New Jersey. In general, the practice of public bidding is universally recognized and deeply imbedded in the public policy of the State of New Jersey. <u>N.E.R.I. Corp. v. New Jersey Highway Authority</u>, 147 <u>N.J.</u> 223, 236 (1996). There is a prima facie presumption that power and discretion of governmental action in awarding bids on public Contracts has been properly exercised. <u>Colonnelli Bros., Inc. v. Village of Ridgefield Park</u>, 284 <u>N.J.Super</u>. 538, 541 (App.Div.1995).

Public bidding statutes are to be construed with sole reference to the public good and rigidly adhered to by courts. <u>Hall Const. Co., Inc. v. New Jersey Sports & Exposition Authority</u>, 295 <u>N.J.Super</u>. 629, 634 (App.Div.1996). Furthermore, public bidding statutes exist for the good of taxpayers, not bidders, and they must always be construed for the public good and to guard against favoritism, improvidence, extravagance, and corruption. <u>Sevell v. New Jersey Highway Authority</u>, 329 <u>N.J.Super</u>. 580, 584 (App.Div.2000).

Every Contract awarded by the contracting agent for the provision or performance of any goods or services, the cost of which in the aggregate exceeds the bid threshold, shall be awarded only by Resolution of the governing body of the contracting unit to the lowest responsible bidder after public advertising for bids and bidding therefore. N.J.S.A. 40A:11-4. "Lowest responsible bidder or vendor" means the bidder or vendor: (a) whose response to a request for bids offers the lowest price and is responsive; and (b) who is responsible. N.J.S.A. 40A:11-2. The lowest responsible bidder on a public Contract must not only be deemed responsible but must submit the lowest bid which conforms to the Contract specifications. Matter of Protest of Award of On-Line Games Production & Operation Services Contract, Bid No. 95-X-20175, 279 N.J.Super. 566, 590 (App.Div.1995).

It is firmly established in New Jersey that material conditions contained in bidding specifications may not be waived. <u>Terminal Const. Corp. v. Atlantic Cty. Sewerage Auth.</u>, 67 N.J. 403, 409 (1975). A contracting body is generally without discretion to accept a defective bid. <u>Meadowbrook Carting Co. v.</u> <u>Borough of Island Heights</u>, 138 N.J. 307, 314 (1994). However, while material conditions contained in bidding specifications may not be waived, this rule does not apply to minor or inconsequential conditions. Public contracting units may resolve problems arising from such conditions in a sensible or practical way. <u>Terminal Const. Corp.</u>, 67 N.J. at 409-11. Materiality of a particular specification is to be determined as a matter of law. <u>Hanover Tp. v. Inter. Fidelity Ins. Co.</u>, 122 N.J.Super. 544, 548 (App.Div.1973).

There are two (2) criteria for determining whether a specific non-compliance constitutes a substantial and, hence, non-waivable irregularity: (1) Whether the effect of a waiver would be to deprive the public body of its assurance that the Contract will be entered into, performed, and guaranteed according to its specific requirements; and (2) Whether it is of such a nature that its waiver would adversely affect competitive bidding by placing a bidder in a position of advantage over the other bidders or by otherwise undermining the necessary common standard of competition. <u>Township of River Vale v. R.J. Longo Constr. Co.</u>, 127 N.J.Super. 207, 222 (Law.Div.1974).

The court has provided further guidance as to materiality where an error is "patent and the true intent of the bidder obvious". In such a situation, the Appellate Division has held that such an error may be disregarded by the public agency. The Court held that certain non-compliance (i.e. obvious error) with the bid specifications may be deemed not material and therefore waivable by the public entity. <u>Spina v. Borough of Fairview</u>, 304 N.J. Super. 425, (App. Div. 1997).

As a matter of law, the Local Public Contract Law requires certain items to be included as material aspects of every bid. The statute reads:

"When required by the bid plans and specifications, the following requirements shall be considered mandatory items to be submitted at the time specified by the contracting unit for the receipt of the bids; the failure to submit any one of the mandatory items shall be deemed a fatal defect that shall render the bid proposal unresponsive and that cannot be cured by the governing body:

a. A guarantee to accompany the bid pursuant to section 21 of P.L.1971, c.198 (C.40A:11-21);

b. A certificate from a surety company pursuant to section 22 of P.L.1971, c.198 (C.40A:11-22);

c. A statement of corporate ownership pursuant to section 1 of P.L.1977, c.33 (C.52:25-24.2);

d. A listing of subcontractors pursuant to section 16 of P.L.1971, c.198 (C.40A:11-16);

e. A document provided by the contracting agent in the bid plans, specifications, or bid proposal documents for the bidder to acknowledge the bidder's receipt of any notice or revisions or addenda to the advertisement or bid documents;"

N.J.S.A. 40A:11-23.2.

Finally, a local contracting unit is permitted to reject all bids within a part under certain conditions. N.J.S.A. 40A:11-13.2, provides in pertinent part:

"A local contracting unit can reject <u>all</u> bids for any of the following reasons:

a. The lowest bid substantially exceeds the cost estimates for the goods or services;

b. The lowest bid substantially exceeds the contracting unit's appropriation for the goods or services;

c. The governing body of the contracting unit decides to abandon the project for provision or performance of the goods or services;

d. The contracting unit wants to substantially revise the specifications for the goods or services;

e. The purposes or provisions or both of P.L.1971, c. 198 (C.40A:11-1 et seq.) are being violated;

f. The governing body of the contracting unit decides to use the State authorized contract pursuant to section 12 of P.L.1971, c. 198 (C.40A:11-12).

N.J.S.A. 40A:11-13.2.

As outlined above, there are no apparent defects within the bid submitted by Advanced Equipment. To the extent a defect may be uncovered, it is my legal opinion that any such defect is minor in nature and may be waived by the Authority pursuant to the Court's holdings in <u>River Vale</u> and <u>Spina</u>.

IV. ADVANCED EQUIPMENT'S BID

My review consisted of an examination of the following documents submitted by Advanced Equipment that the Authority has provided:

- 1. Bidder's Checklist;
- 2. Statement of Ownership Disclosure;
- 3. Non-Collusion Affidavit;
- 4. Bid Proposal;
- 5. Acknowledgment of Receipt of Addenda;
- 6. Cashier's Check;

- 7. Bidder's Experience/References;
- 8. Mandatory Designation of Subcontractors and/or Bidder's Own Workforce;
- 9. New Jersey Business Registration Certificate;
- 10. Certificate of Authority;
- 11. Disclosure of Investment Activities in Iran Form;
- 12. IRS Form W-9;
- 13. Public Works Contractor Registration Act Certificate;
- 14. OSEC Documentation;
- 15. Department of Labor and Workforce Development Permit;
- 16. Certification of Non-Debarment for Federal Government Contracts.

The bid submitted by Advanced Equipment is in the appropriate form.

V. <u>CONCLUSION</u>

After researching the applicable law, reviewing the Contract specifications and documents, and conferring with staff, it is my legal opinion that the Contract for MISC-44-23, for the Inspection, OEM Maintenance and Equipment Repair Services at the Intermediate Processing Facility on behalf of the Authority be awarded to Advanced Equipment. Please note that Advanced Equipment must supply Insurance Certificate and Affirmative Action Information prior to the execution of an agreement. It is recommended that a Resolution be placed on the Agenda for an upcoming meeting awarding said Contract subject to staff concurrence and the availability of funds.
