# Construction Status Report - October 25, 2023 - Thomas J. LaRocco

32nd Street Pump Station Piping & Pump Upgrades - The purpose of this project is to replace piping, fittings, valves and appurtenances on the dry side of the well to remediate poor material conditions, and to improve the operational flexibility of the station. The installation of three (3) new sets of pumps and motors that were procured independently of this contract shall also be completed. Mobilization of bypass pumping equipment began on October 16th. By October 19th, the station was in full bypass mode. Demolition and removal of existing piping and pumping equipment in the dry well began on October 23rd. It is expected that demolition work will continue until November 5th, at which time the installation of new piping components is to begin.

Wildwood/Lower Region Furnish and Install New Centrifugal Blowers – The purpose of this project is to replace three of four existing blowers, and to provide new controls to the three new blowers and the single, existing rebuilt blower. These blowers provide process air to the facility's entire treatment system. Two (2) of the new blowers will have capacities that are less than those of the original units so as to more efficiently accommodate off-season demands. This project was awarded on March 1, 2023. Notice to Proceed was issued, effective March 22, 2023. A preconstruction meeting was held on April 5, 2023. Due to equipment lead time requirements, the Contractor does not expect to begin physical work until January, 2024. Currently, the review of technical submittals and material procurement is ongoing.

<u>Various Regions Disposal of RBCs and Other Miscellaneous Equipment</u> - The purpose of this project is to remove and dispose of various pieces of surplus equipment that are in poor condition in order to provide more working space at the Authority's Ocean City, Wildwood/Lower and Cape May Wastewater Treatment Facilities. Work includes the loading, hauling, unloading and disposal of nineteen (19) RBC shaft assemblies, two (2) storage tanks and, on an "if and where directed" basis, eight (8) storage containers and other miscellaneous treatment equipment. All assigned pay item work has been completed. Tasks recently completed by Garton's as part of the contract's contingency allowance include the installation of a new scum concentrator on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor of the Wildwood/Lower Sludge Processing Building on October 12<sup>th</sup>, and the direct removal of three RBCs from the Ocean City treatment tank on October 16<sup>th</sup>.

Demolition and Disposal of Various Structures and Equipment at the Sludge Composting Facility - The purpose of this project is to demolish and dispose of structures and equipment at the Sludge Composting Facility that have not been in use since the fire of 2015. The Reactor, Amendment, Operations and Maintenance, Blower, and Storage Buildings, as well as Chemical and Odor Control Facilities with related appurtenances are to be safely removed in accordance with the governing regulations. This project was awarded on September 6, 2023. Notice to Proceed was issued, effective October 10, 2023. A preconstruction meeting was held on October 17, 2023. It is expected that the Contractor will mobilize onsite on November 13, 2023.

# 1.0 General

# **Annual Plant Inspection**

A representative from the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) performed inspections of all of the four (4) wastewater treatment facilities, took field samples, as well performed their annual records review during the month of October. All facilities were given a positive report with no noted deficiencies

# Limble Computer Maintenance Management System

The CMCMUA has endeavored to find a Computer Maintenance Management System (CMMS) that could provide ease of use and flexibility to; track assets, develop recurring maintenance intervals, log and categorize time spent and begin the shift from a reactionary maintenance program to a planned maintenance program. The most recent program (Limble) was instituted in August of 2022. Since that time the plants have worked diligently to enter all assets in the system and develop the recurring Preventative Maintenance Tasks required of each piece of equipment. Additionally, the maintenance personnel have worked hard to develop an understanding of how to use the system, as well as, how the system helps with managing the field work load.

Below are some basic metrics used to see how the system is developing in terms of field acceptance and workload.

# SCADA (Supervisory Control And Data Acquisition)

# **Design Contract**

Avanceon continues to work with the IT Department and Operational Staff to refine the new SCADA system throughout the Seven Mile Beach/Middle Wastewater Treatment Facility. Preparations are being made for the upcoming construction contract for Cape May, Wildwood and Ocean City Facilities.

Contract SM-04-21 Seven Mile Beach/Middle Region Control System SCADA Upgrade is complete. Contract WW-13-23 SCADA OC, WW/L & CM was approved and executed. The notice to proceed for contract WW-13-23 was issued on August 21, 2023 with the contract duration ending on November 18, 2025. The tentative start of construction is the middle to the end of November starting in the Cape May Facility. This contract covers the SCADA upgrade work in the Cape May Region, Ocean City Region and the Wildwood/Lower Region.

# Rotating Biological Contactor (RBC) Electrical Upgrades at the Wildwood/Lower Wastewater Treatment Facility:

As part of the Wastewater Program's 20 year Capital Renewal and Replacement Plan, Wilwood/Lower Region has begun to ship out Rotating Biological Contactor (RBC) control panels (buckets) for refurbishment to allow monitoring and control through the upcoming Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) system. The contract vendor, United

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Electric/Schneider Electric, is in receipt of 64 RBC buckets with a progressive schedule for sending and receiving the control buckets for refurbishment.

Forty (40) refurbished RBC MCC buckets have been received. Progressive weekly shipments of five (5) are expected through November. Additional buckets are being readied for shipment. In total 127 buckets are being refurbished. The return schedule will run through the first half of next year.

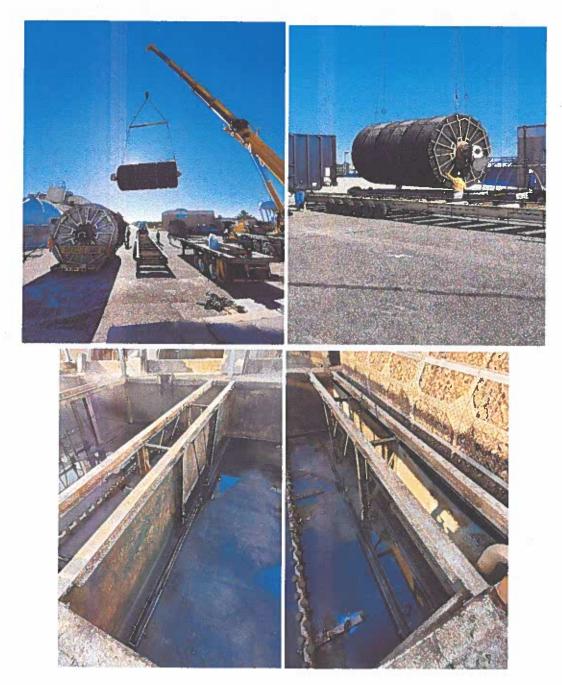


**RBC** control buckets

# RBC and RBR Replacement at the Ocean City Wastewater Treatment Facility:

As part of the Wastewater Program's 20-Year Capital Renewal and Replacement Program, the replacement of Rotating Biological Contactor (RBC) media and shafts as well as the rehabilitation of the Rotating Biological Reactor (RBR) shafts project is being completed during the 2023 and 2024 off season.

Bay #3 is the last remaining RBC Bay to be replaced in Ocean City. The Project Crew (PC) removed the RBC shafts from RBC Bay #3 during the month of October for ultimate disposal. The PC along with OC operations vacuumed and removed all debris from the RBC bay. The aluminum catwalks were then inspected by the Chief Engineer and parts were identified for replacement. Fortunately, not all of the aluminum components were beyond their lifecycle. Repairs to the catwalks will be made prior to receiving the new RBCs. (See the pictures on the following page.)

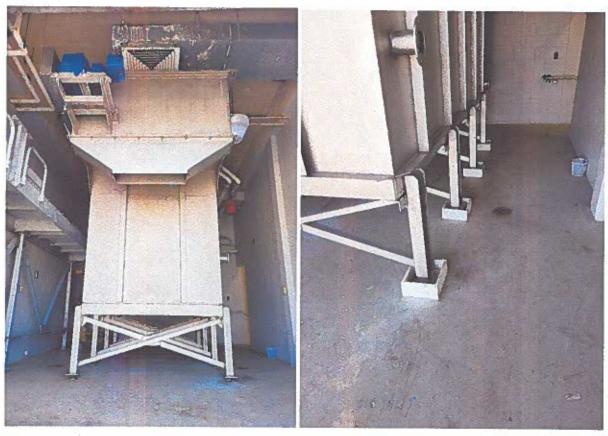
Scum Concentrator Replacement at Seven Mile Beach/Middle and Wildwood/ Lower WTP As part of the Wastewater Program's 20-Year Capital Renewal and Replacement Program, the Authority is replacing the Scum Concentrators at the Seven Mile Beach/Middle and the Wildwood/Lower WTFs. A scum concentrator combines dewatering by gravity separation with a heated day tank for further processing of concentrated scum and grease. This system provides the means to keep grease skimmings pumpable to be transferred for disposal.

The scum concentrators have been received. Procurement of glass lined ductile iron pipe and CPVC pipe is under way. The scum transfer pumps have been received for both SMM and WW/L.

During the month of October, the Project Crew (PC) continued construction of the Scum Concentrator projects at WW/L and SMM.

Work at the SMM Region consisted of installing conduit to the primary scum pit and providing electricity to the new pump installation. Additionally, the PC set the scum tank, leveled it and installed grout bases for the support structures.



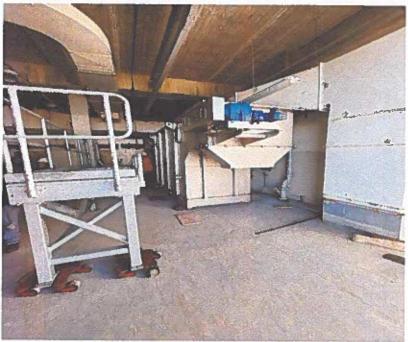
**SMM Scum Concentrator installation** 



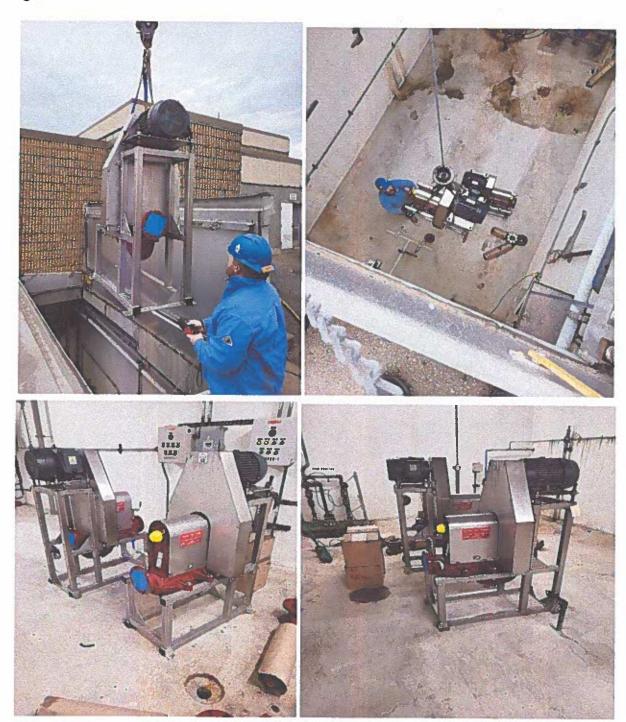
SMM Primary Scum Pit electrical installation

The Project Crew personnel along with Garton's Rigging placed the WW/L scum concentrator into the building and set the unit in place. PC personnel also lifted the pumps in the scum pits for installation. PC personnel constructed and installed the guide rail system for the Scum Concentrator roll off container. This consisted of fabricating the guides from stock steel and anchoring the guides to the floor as well as installing steel to protect the front edge of the building when loading or unloading the dumpsters. 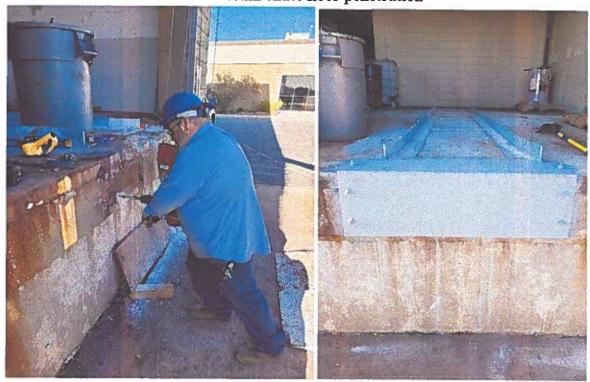
WW/L Scum Concentrator placement

WW/L scum chute floor penetration



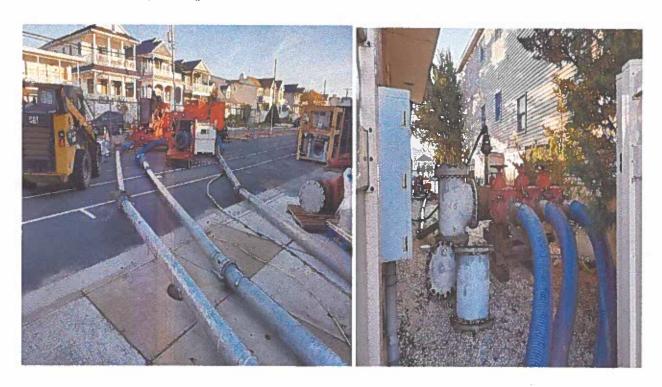

# 32nd Street Pump Station Upgrades

As part of the Wastewater Program's 20-Year Capital Renewal and Replacement Program, the 32nd Street Pump Station is being upgraded with new pumps, updated internal pipework as well as Variable Frequency Drives (VFD). The pumps were procured under contract OC-EQUIP-23-20 and the installation of the pumps along with the internal piping upgrades will be completed under contract OC-18-22 beginning October 2023.

On Monday October 16th, Municipal Maintenance was onsite installing bypass equipment in the front and rear manholes of this station. On Thursday October 19th the station was switched over to bypass and the Ocean City staff was onsite to assist in the process. While it is ultimately the responsibility of the contractor to maintain operation of the bypass, the Ocean City staff is constantly monitoring the system, coordinating with the contractor, and fielding questions from the public to ensure its success.

As stated in the November 1, 2023 Construction Status Report, the Contractor has made great strides in a relatively short period of time.



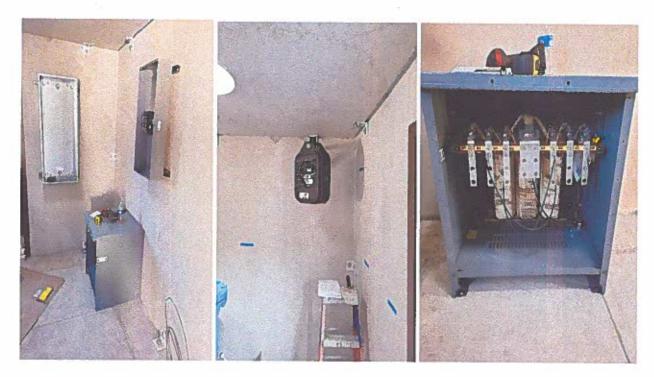
32nd St bypass operations

## **Backflow Preventer Building Installation**

As part of the Wastewater Program's 20-Year Capital Renewal and Replacement Program, the Authority is replacing the existing backflow preventers throughout the Seven Mile Region that are at the end of their useful lives. This project is to replace all of these devices with one backflow preventer. This will reduce maintenance costs as well reduce the number of permits needed from four (4) to one (1).

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The SMM Plant Electrician with assistance from the Project Crew is installing the interior electrical components for this project. The electricians are installing the main service, transformer, building heater, lighting and monitoring equipment. Once the components are mounted the crew will trench the electrical service and conduct a start-up of the ancillary equipment.

# 3.2 Repair and Maintenance Projects

#### **Truck Maintenance**

Project Crew continues to conduct routine maintenance and repairs on the sludge transportation vehicles. This month they were tasked with removing old wear strips and replacing them with new ones. The wear strips shield the truck components from the sludge cans when they are being loaded onto the truck.



# **OC 3rd Street Seasonal Maintenance**

The Ocean City Operations and Maintenance personnel installed a new suction valve on Pump #1. This valve had failed and the actuator was unable to lift the valve. The crew vacuumed out the station and removed the majority of the sand and scum build up in the wet well. The crew then removed the old valve and installed a new valve in this location. # Reclaimed Water for Beneficial Reuse (RWBR) Refurbishment

The Seven Mile Middle operations team is currently in the process of rehabilitating the RWBR system. The project includes the replacement of filter media, spot repairs to the interior of the tanks, repairs to the drains and air distribution system within the tank, repainting the interior of the tank, and repairs to pipe work and instrumentation within the control building. So far, the team has removed the media (about 80 tons), made significant progress with powerwashing and surface preparation in the interior of the tank. The crew has also removed the sample pipe where turbidity and total suspended solids are measured. This pipe will be replaced along with the instrumentation associated with it. 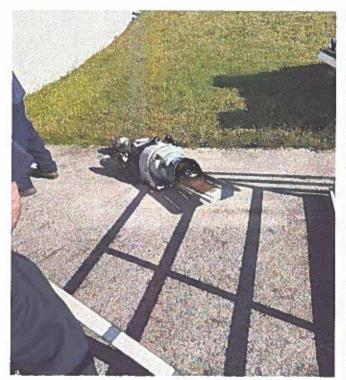




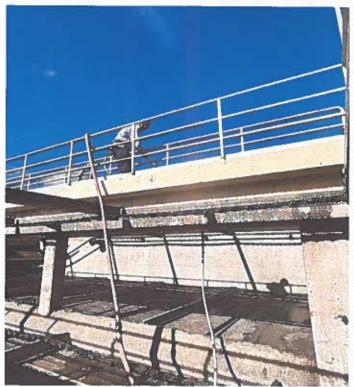

#### Clarifier Drive Maintenance

The Seven Mile Middle Maintenance staff performed seasonal maintenance on secondary clarifier #3 and #4. This work included power washing and cleaning of the clarifier tanks, inspection of all flights and chains. The clarifier chain drive gearbox was removed by Plant Mechanic, Ed Houlroyd and Maintenance Worker, Harry Cowan and sent out for machine shop work. After the gearbox is returned, it will be painted and reinstalled so that it is ready for the 2024 summer season. These gearboxes are original to the plant. Parts and materials have become hard to come by, so keeping them on a strict rebuild schedule is imperative to ensure their availability during peak season. This marks four of our eight gearboxes that have had a complete rebuild. The remaining gearboxes are scheduled for in the 2024 and 2025 off-seasons. (See pictures on the following page.)

# **SMM Radio Communication Issues**

Radio communication with the Burleigh and Mayville Pumping Stations have long been an issue due to the existence of trees and long distances between the pump station and the communications tower located at Seven Mile Beach/Middle WTP. During the summer, the Authority had several trees removed at the Burleigh location in an attempt to increase signal strength and reliability.

In an effort to further improve communication issues, the IT department recommended that old communication equipment be removed and the current equipment be raised to the top of the mast. Plant Electrician, Chris Kellaway with assistance from Utility Worker II, Jim Knox were tasked with the job. The pictures below are from both Burleigh and Mayville equipment adjustments were being conducted.

The IT department continues to monitor the signal strength and communication loss events and assist operations as needed.

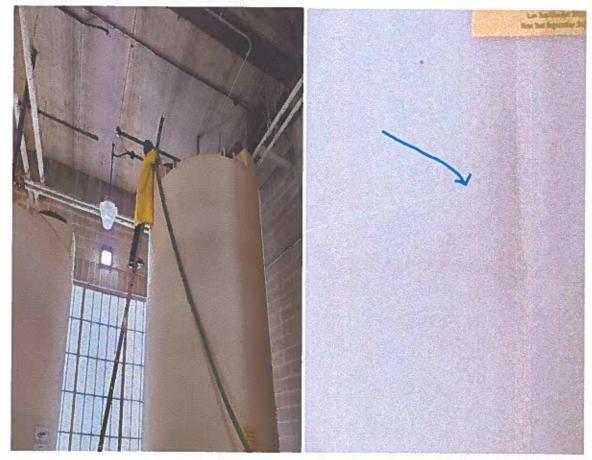
# Avalon Manor Pump Station Maintenance and Repair

Operations was tasked with cleaning out the wet well at the pump station. During the wet well cleaning it was discovered that a fitting was broken off of the bubbler line. Parts were gathered and after the cleaning was done, a repair was made to the bubbler line. # Sodium Hypochlorite Storage Tank Leak

On 10/24/23 Senior Operator Adam Scheick noticed something unusual when walking the plant and entering the Chemical Addition Room (Sodium Hypochlorite Room). While the room normally has some chemical odor, Adam right away noticed that the strength of the odor was much higher than normal. He immediately began investigating and quickly found a leak in the 8,500 gallon Sodium Hypochlorite tank. Pictured below is a very hard to see photo of the leak on the tank. Adam quickly realized that while the situation was not critical yet, it could very quickly become a major safety concern if the hole in the tank became worse. Adam notified his supervisors that he would be notifying all employees to stay away from the room as well as isolating the east entrance to the room as well as the walkway nearest the chemical containment in order to keep his co-workers out of harm's way. Adam, Shift Operator, Tom Gavin & Utility Worker IV, Sam Bakley manipulated the valving so that this tank would equalize with our 6,100 gallon Sodium Hypochlorite tank. Within an hour of finding the problem the tanks were equalized and the head pressure had lessened enough on the compromised tank that the leak had stopped. The tank manufacturer was notified of the leak and offered a repair recommendation. A repair to the tank is scheduled for this month. (See pictures on the following page.)

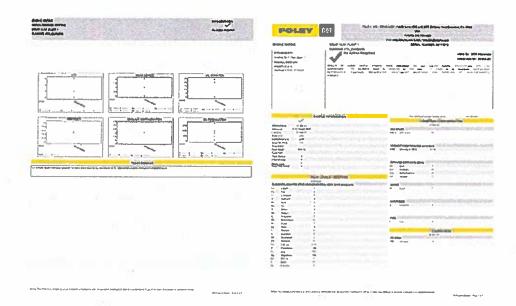
# WW/L Oil Testing Program

In an effort to streamline the maintenance activities and reduce costs, the WW/L Mechanic and his team started an oil testing program for the WW/L auxiliary generators. Typically oil changes are required annually or every 500 hours. A generator may contain up to 20 gallons of oil. We have 40 generators throughout the wastewater program. Maximizing the useful life of the oil is

the most responsible way to manage this consumable. Savings are presented in procurement, waste disposal and labor.

Under contract with Foley Cat, the maintenance team collected oil samples from all of the WW/L Region auxiliary generators and sent them out to Foley Cat for testing. All parameters on all eleven (11) generators in Wildwood were "in the green" and did not exceed normal specifications for the oil health and no excessive wear was indicated at this time.

WW/L personnel identified a failed discharge pipe within the sump pit of the Administration Building. Operations and maintenance personnel isolated power to the sump pit, vacuumed out the pit, made entry to repair the piping connection and had the system back in operation by the end of the day.

#### I. INTRODUCTION

I have reviewed the documents provided regarding the bid submissions with respect to the contract MISC-32-23, 2024 Miscellaneous Services – Buried Piping Systems on behalf of the Cape May County Municipal Utilities Authority ("CMCMUA" and/or "Authority"). The CMCMUA received four (4) bids for this Contract. The bids were received on Thursday, October 26, 2023, at 2:00 p.m. as follows:

Vendor	Total Amount Bid
1. CTX Infrastructure	\$231,950.00
2. West Bay Construction, Inc.	\$232,500.00
3. Crest Construction Group, LLC	\$239,900.00
4. Arthur R. Henry, Inc.	\$248,500.00
Engineer's Estimate	<u>\$250,000.00</u>

### II. <u>FACTUAL ANALYSIS</u>

The bid specifications sought bids for a contractor to furnish all necessary labor, supervision, equipment, tools and/or materials required to perform the following construction services: removal, replacement, supply, and/or installation of various diameters of CIP, DIP, RCP, PEP, HDPE, SS, and PVC pipe; removal, replacement and installation of manholes and manhole riser sections; coring of manhole riser sections, raising and lowering of manhole frames and covers; installation of permanent watertight bulkheads; earthwork including excavation, dewatering and backfill; site work (clearing, grubbing, grading,

drainage structures, paving, curbing, sidewalks, etc.) and other miscellaneous work for the time period January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2024. See Bid Specifications Section IV(1.0), Technical Specifications, General. The specifications make clear that the hours specified are based on the Authority's best estimates, are not final and may increase or decrease based upon the actual work required under the contract. See Bid Specifications, Section IV(3.0), Technical Specifications, Quantities Estimated.

The apparent low bid was submitted by CTX Infrastructure ("CTX"). Upon review of the bid submitted by CTX, it was uncovered that the bidder did not submit Affirmative Action Information or Insurance Information within their original bid package. However, the bid specifications provide that the Affirmative Action Information and Insurance Information must be submitted prior to the contract being executed. See Bid Specifications, Section II(XI), General Instruction to Bidders, Mandatory Affirmative Action Certification; See Bid Specifications, Section III, Specific Instructions to Bidders, Insurance Requirements. As such, there are no defects in the bid submitted by CTX from a legal perspective.

The bid was further reviewed from a technical perspective by Mr. Thomas LaRocco, Chief Engineer on behalf of the Authority, Mr. Joshua Palombo, Wastewater Program Manager on behalf of the Authority, and Mr. John Conturo, Solid Waste Program Manager on behalf of the Authority. Following their review, Mr. LaRocco, Mr. Palombo, and Mr. Conturo opined that the bid submitted by CTX complied with the technical specifications and thereafter recommended the award of the contract to CTX.

#### III. LEGAL ANAYLSIS

The Local Public Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1 et seq. regulates bidding on Contracts of public entities in New Jersey. In general, the practice of public bidding is universally recognized and deeply imbedded in the public policy of the State of New Jersey. N.E.R.I. Corp. v. New Jersey Highway Authority, 147 N.J. 223, 236 (1996). There is a prima facie presumption that power and discretion of governmental action in awarding bids on public Contracts has been properly exercised. Colonnelli Bros., Inc. v. Village of Ridgefield Park, 284 N.J.Super. 538, 541 (App.Div.1995).

Public bidding statutes are to be construed with sole reference to the public good and rigidly adhered to by courts. Hall Const. Co., Inc. v. New Jersey Sports & Exposition Authority, 295 N.J.Super. 629, 634 (App.Div.1996). Furthermore, public bidding statutes exist for the good of taxpayers, not bidders, and they must always be construed for the public good and to guard against favoritism, improvidence, extravagance, and corruption. Sevell v. New Jersey Highway Authority, 329 N.J.Super. 580, 584 (App.Div.2000).

Every Contract awarded by the contracting agent for the provision or performance of any goods or services, the cost of which in the aggregate exceeds the bid threshold, shall be awarded only by Resolution of the governing body of the contracting unit to the lowest responsible bidder after public advertising for bids and bidding therefore. N.J.S.A. 40A:11-4. "Lowest responsible bidder or vendor" means the bidder or vendor: (a) whose response to a request for bids offers the lowest price and is responsive; and (b) who is responsible. N.J.S.A. 40A:11-2. The lowest responsible bidder on a public Contract must not only be deemed responsible but must submit the lowest bid which conforms to the Contract specifications. Matter

of Protest of Award of On-Line Games Production & Operation Services Contract, Bid No. 95-X-20175, 279 N.J.Super. 566, 590 (App.Div.1995).

It is firmly established in New Jersey that material conditions contained in bidding specifications may not be waived. Terminal Const. Corp. v. Atlantic Cty. Sewerage Auth., 67 N.J. 403, 409 (1975). A contracting body is generally without discretion to accept a defective bid. Meadowbrook Carting Co. v. Borough of Island Heights, 138 N.J. 307, 314 (1994). However, while material conditions contained in bidding specifications may not be waived, this rule does not apply to minor or inconsequential conditions. Public contracting units may resolve problems arising from such conditions in a sensible or practical way. Terminal Const. Corp., 67 N.J. at 409-11. Materiality of a particular specification is to be determined as a matter of law. Hanover Tp. v. Inter. Fidelity Ins. Co., 122 N.J.Super. 544, 548 (App.Div.1973).

There are two (2) criteria for determining whether a specific non-compliance constitutes a substantial and, hence, non-waivable irregularity: (1) Whether the effect of a waiver would be to deprive the public body of its assurance that the Contract will be entered into, performed, and guaranteed according to its specific requirements; and (2) Whether it is of such a nature that its waiver would adversely affect competitive bidding by placing a bidder in a position of advantage over the other bidders or by otherwise undermining the necessary common standard of competition. Township of River Vale v. R.J. Longo Constr. Co., 127 N.J.Super. 207, 222 (Law.Div.1974).

The court has provided further guidance as to materiality where an error is "patent and the true intent of the bidder obvious". In such a situation, the Appellate Division has held that such an error may be disregarded by the public agency. The Court held that certain non-compliance (i.e. obvious error) with the bid specifications may be deemed not material and therefore waivable by the public entity. Spina v. Borough of Fairview, 304 N.J. Super. 425, (App. Div. 1997).

As a matter of law, the Local Public Contract Law requires certain items to be included as material aspects of every bid. The statute reads:

"When required by the bid plans and specifications, the following requirements shall be considered mandatory items to be submitted at the time specified by the contracting unit for the receipt of the bids; the failure to submit any one of the mandatory items shall be deemed a fatal defect that shall render the bid proposal unresponsive and that cannot be cured by the governing body:

- a. A guarantee to accompany the bid pursuant to section 21 of P.L.1971, c.198 (C.40A:11-21);
- b. A certificate from a surety company pursuant to section 22 of P.L.1971, c.198 (C.40A:11-22);
- c. A statement of corporate ownership pursuant to section 1 of P.L.1977, c.33 (C.52:25-24.2);

- d. A listing of subcontractors pursuant to section 16 of P.L.1971, c.198 (C.40A:11-16);
- e. A document provided by the contracting agent in the bid plans, specifications, or bid proposal documents for the bidder to acknowledge the bidder's receipt of any notice or revisions or addenda to the advertisement or bid documents;"

N.J.S.A. 40A:11-23.2.

Finally, a local contracting unit is permitted to reject all bids within a part under certain conditions. N.J.S.A. 40A:11-13.2, provides in pertinent part:

- "A local contracting unit can reject <u>all</u> bids for any of the following reasons:
- a. The lowest bid substantially exceeds the cost estimates for the goods or services;
- b. The lowest bid substantially exceeds the contracting unit's appropriation for the goods or services;
- c. The governing body of the contracting unit decides to abandon the project for provision or performance of the goods or services;
- d. The contracting unit wants to substantially revise the specifications for the goods or services;
- e. The purposes or provisions or both of P.L.1971, c. 198 (C.40A:11-1 et seq.) are being violated;
- f. The governing body of the contracting unit decides to use the State authorized contract pursuant to section 12 of P.L.1971, c. 198 (C.40A:11-12).

N.J.S.A. 40A:11-13.2.

As outlined above, there are no apparent defects within the bid submitted by CTX. To the extent a defect may be uncovered, it is my legal opinion that any such defect is minor in nature and may be waived by the Authority pursuant to the Court's holdings in River Vale and Spina.

My review consisted of an examination of the following documents submitted by CTX that the Authority has provided:

- 13. Mandatory Designation of Subcontractors and/or Bidder's Own Workforce;
- 14. New Jersey Business Registration Certificate;
- 15. Disclosure of Investment Activities in Iran Form;
- 16. IRS Form W-9;
- 17. Public Works Contractor Registration Act Certificate;
- 18. Lowest Bidder Prevailing Wage Certification;
- 19. Certification of Non-Debarment for Federal Government Contracts.

The bid submitted by CTX is in the appropriate form.

It is recommended that a Resolution be placed on the Agenda for an upcoming meeting awarding said Contract subject to staff concurrence and the availability of funds.

The apparent low bidder for the above referenced contract was Multi-Temp Mechanical, Inc. ("Multi-Temp"). Upon review of the bid submitted by Multi-Temp, no defects were found within the bid and the bid submitted was compliant with the bid specifications from a legal perspective. The bid was reviewed from a technical perspective by Thomas LaRocco, Chief Engineer on behalf of the Authority, Joshua Palombo, Wastewater Program Manager on behalf of the Authority, and John Conturo, Solid Waste Program Manager on behalf of their Authority. Following their review, Mr. LaRocco, Mr. Palombo, and Mr. Conturo opined that the bid submitted by Multi-Temp complies with the technical specifications.

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The Local Public Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1 et seq. regulates bidding on Contracts of public entities in New Jersey. In general, the practice of public bidding is universally recognized and deeply imbedded in the public policy of the State of New Jersey. N.E.R.I. Corp. v. New Jersey Highway Authority, 147 N.J. 223, 236 (1996). There is a prima facie presumption that power and discretion of governmental action in awarding bids on public Contracts has been properly exercised. Colonnelli Bros., Inc. v. Village of Ridgefield Park, 284 N.J.Super. 538, 541 (App.Div.1995).

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It is firmly established in New Jersey that material conditions contained in bidding specifications may not be waived. Terminal Const. Corp. v. Atlantic Cty. Sewerage Auth., 67 N.J. 403, 409 (1975). A contracting body is generally without discretion to accept a defective bid. Meadowbrook Carting Co. v. Borough of Island Heights, 138 N.J. 307, 314 (1994). However, while material conditions contained in bidding specifications may not be waived, this rule does not apply to minor or inconsequential conditions. Public contracting units may resolve problems arising from such conditions in a sensible or practical way. Terminal Const. Corp., 67 N.J. at 409-11. Materiality of a particular specification is to be determined as a matter of law. Hanover Tp. v. Inter. Fidelity Ins. Co., 122 N.J.Super. 544, 548 (App.Div.1973).

There are two (2) criteria for determining whether a specific non-compliance constitutes a substantial and, hence, non-waivable irregularity: (1) Whether the effect of a waiver would be to deprive the public body of its assurance that the Contract will be entered into, performed, and guaranteed according to its specific requirements; and (2) Whether it is of such a nature that its waiver would adversely affect competitive bidding by placing a bidder in a position of advantage over the other bidders or by otherwise undermining the necessary common standard of competition. Township of River Vale v. R.J. Longo Constr. Co., 127 N.J.Super. 207, 222 (Law.Div.1974).

The court has provided further guidance as to materiality where an error is "patent and the true intent of the bidder obvious". In such a situation, the Appellate Division has held that such an error may be disregarded by the public agency. The Court held that certain non-compliance (i.e. obvious error) with the bid specifications may be deemed not material and therefore waivable by the public entity. Spina v. Borough of Fairview, 304 N.J. Super. 425, (App. Div. 1997).

As a matter of law, the Local Public Contract Law requires certain items to be included as material aspects of every bid. The statute reads:

"When required by the bid plans and specifications, the following requirements shall be considered mandatory items to be submitted at the time specified by the contracting unit for the receipt of the bids; the failure to submit any one of the mandatory items shall be deemed a fatal defect that shall render the bid proposal unresponsive and that cannot be cured by the governing body:

- a. A guarantee to accompany the bid pursuant to section 21 of P.L.1971, c. 198 (C.40A:11-21);
- b. A certificate from a surety company pursuant to section 22 of P.L.1971, c. 198 (C.40A:11-22);
- c. A statement of corporate ownership pursuant to section 1 of P.L.1977, c. 33 (C.52:25-24.2);
- d. A listing of subcontractors pursuant to section 16 of P.L.1971, c. 198 (C.40A:11-16);
- e. A document provided by the contracting agent in the bid plans, specifications, or bid proposal documents for the bidder to acknowledge the bidder's receipt of any notice or revisions or addenda to the advertisement or bid documents."

N.J.S.A. 40A:11-23.2.

Finally, a local contracting unit is permitted to reject all bids within a part under certain conditions. N.J.S.A. 40A:11-13.2, provides as follows:

- "A contracting unit may reject all bids for any of the following reasons:
- a. The lowest bid substantially exceeds the cost estimates for the goods or services;
- b. The lowest bid substantially exceeds the contracting unit's appropriation for the goods or services;
- c. The governing body of the contracting unit decides to abandon the project for provision or performance of the goods or services;
- d. The contracting unit wants to substantially revise the specifications for the goods or services;
- e. The purposes or provisions or both of P.L.1971, c. 198 (C.40A:11-1 et seq.) are being violated;
- f. The governing body of the contracting unit decides to use the State authorized contract pursuant to section 12 of P.L.1971, c. 198 (C.40A:11-12)."

#### N.J.S.A. 40A:11-13.2.

As outlined above, there are no apparent defects within the bid submitted by Multi-Temp. To the extent a defect may be uncovered, it is my legal opinion that any such defect is minor in nature and may be waived by the Authority pursuant to the Court's holdings in <u>River Vale</u> and <u>Spina</u>.

It is therefore recommended that a Resolution be placed on the Agenda for an upcoming meeting awarding said Contract to Multi-Temp subject to staff concurrence and the availability of funds.

The bid specifications sought bids for a contractor to furnish all necessary labor, supervision, equipment, tools and/or materials for miscellaneous repairs, modifications or new installations of electrical work through the CMCMUA Regional Facilities to be performed by their own employees, without the use of a subcontractor for the time period January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2024. See Bid Specifications Section IV(1.0), Technical Specifications, General. The specifications make clear that the hours specified are based on the Authority's best estimates, but are not final and may increase or decrease based upon the actual work required under the contract. See Bid Specifications, Section IV(3.0), Technical Specifications, Quantities Estimated.

- e. The purposes or provisions or both of P.L.1971, c. 198 (C.40A:11-1 et seq.) are being violated;
- f. The governing body of the contracting unit decides to use the State authorized contract pursuant to section 12 of P.L.1971, c. 198 (C.40A:11-12).

#### N.J.S.A. 40A:11-13.2.

As outlined above, there are no apparent defects within the bid submitted by Scalfo. To the extent a defect may be uncovered, it is my legal opinion that any such defect is minor in nature and may be waived by the Authority pursuant to the Court's holdings in <u>River Vale</u> and <u>Spina</u>.

It is recommended that a Resolution be placed on the Agenda for an upcoming meeting awarding said Contract subject to staff concurrence and the availability of funds.

### I. INTRODUCTION

I have reviewed the documents provided regarding the bid submission with respect to the contract SLF-35-23, 2024 Landfill Cap Liner Miscellaneous Repair Services on behalf of the Cape May County Municipal Utilities Authority ("CMCMUA" and/or "Authority"). The CMCMUA received one (1) bid for this Contract. The bid was received on Thursday, October 26, 2023, at 2:00 p.m. as follows:

<u>Vendor</u> <u>Total Amount Bid</u>

1. Atlantic Lining Co., Inc. \$188,000.00

Engineer's Estimate \$200,000.00

#### II. <u>FACTUAL ANALYSIS</u>

The Authority operates a Class 1 NJDEP Approved Sanitary Landfill. During the course of operation for the Facility, portions of the landfill reaching interim heights have been covered utilizing temporary capping materials of both High Density Polyethylene (HDPE) and LinearLow Density Polyethylene (LLDPE) to control rainfall and water entry into fill areas. The bid is for the provision of experienced and expert manpower, equipment and/or material for repair to such liners on an "as needed" basis as determined by the Authority. See Bid Specifications Section IV(1.0), Technical Specifications, General. The work period for the contract shall be from January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2024. See Bid Specifications Section IV(1.0), Technical Specifications, General.

The apparent low bid was submitted by Atlantic Lining Company, Inc. ("Atlantic Lining"). Upon review of the bid submitted by Atlantic Lining, it was uncovered that the bidder did not submit Affirmative Action Information within their original bid package. However, the bid specifications provide that the Affirmative Action Information must be submitted prior to the contract being executed. See Bid Specifications, Section II(XI), General Instruction to Bidders, Mandatory Affirmative Action Certification. As such, there are no defects in the bid submitted by Atlantic Lining from a legal perspective.

The bid was further reviewed from a technical perspective by Mr. Thomas LaRocco, Chief Engineer on behalf of the Authority and Mr. John Conturo, Solid Waste Program Manager on behalf of the Authority. Following their review, Mr. LaRocco and Mr. Conturo opined that the bid submitted by Atlantic Lining complied with the technical specifications and thereafter recommended the award of the contract to Atlantic Lining.

### III. <u>LEGAL ANAYLSIS</u>

The Local Public Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1 et seq. regulates bidding on Contracts of public entities in New Jersey. In general, the practice of public bidding is universally recognized and deeply imbedded in the public policy of the State of New Jersey. N.E.R.I. Corp. v. New Jersey Highway Authority, 147 N.J. 223, 236 (1996). There is a prima facie presumption that power and discretion of governmental action in awarding bids on public Contracts has been properly exercised. Colonnelli Bros., Inc. v. Village of Ridgefield Park, 284 N.J.Super. 538, 541 (App.Div.1995).

Public bidding statutes are to be construed with sole reference to the public good and rigidly adhered to by courts. Hall Const. Co., Inc. v. New Jersey Sports & Exposition Authority, 295 N.J.Super. 629, 634 (App.Div.1996). Furthermore, public bidding statutes exist for the good of taxpayers, not bidders, and they must always be construed for the public good and to guard against favoritism, improvidence, extravagance, and corruption. Sevell v. New Jersey Highway Authority, 329 N.J.Super. 580, 584 (App.Div.2000).

Every Contract awarded by the contracting agent for the provision or performance of any goods or services, the cost of which in the aggregate exceeds the bid threshold, shall be awarded only by Resolution of the governing body of the contracting unit to the lowest responsible bidder after public advertising for bids and bidding therefore. N.J.S.A. 40A:11-4. "Lowest responsible bidder or vendor" means the bidder or vendor: (a) whose response to a request for bids offers the lowest price and is responsive; and (b) who is responsible. N.J.S.A. 40A:11-2. The lowest responsible bidder on a public Contract must not only be deemed responsible but must submit the lowest bid which conforms to the Contract specifications. Matter of Protest of Award of On-Line Games Production & Operation Services Contract, Bid No. 95-X-20175, 279 N.J.Super. 566, 590 (App.Div.1995).

It is firmly established in New Jersey that material conditions contained in bidding specifications may not be waived. <u>Terminal Const. Corp. v. Atlantic Cty. Sewerage Auth.</u>, 67 <u>N.J.</u> 403, 409 (1975). A contracting body is generally without discretion to accept a defective bid. <u>Meadowbrook Carting Co. v. Borough of Island Heights</u>, 138 <u>N.J.</u> 307, 314 (1994). However, while material conditions contained in

bidding specifications may not be waived, this rule does not apply to minor or inconsequential conditions. Public contracting units may resolve problems arising from such conditions in a sensible or practical way. <u>Terminal Const. Corp.</u>, 67 N.J. at 409-11. Materiality of a particular specification is to be determined as a matter of law. Hanover Tp. v. Inter. Fidelity Ins. Co., 122 N.J.Super. 544, 548 (App.Div.1973).

There are two (2) criteria for determining whether a specific non-compliance constitutes a substantial and, hence, non-waivable irregularity: (1) Whether the effect of a waiver would be to deprive the public body of its assurance that the Contract will be entered into, performed, and guaranteed according to its specific requirements; and (2) Whether it is of such a nature that its waiver would adversely affect competitive bidding by placing a bidder in a position of advantage over the other bidders or by otherwise undermining the necessary common standard of competition. Township of River Vale v. R.J. Longo Constr. Co., 127 N.J.Super. 207, 222 (Law.Div.1974).

The court has provided further guidance as to materiality where an error is "patent and the true intent of the bidder obvious". In such a situation, the Appellate Division has held that such an error may be disregarded by the public agency. The Court held that certain non-compliance (i.e. obvious error) with the bid specifications may be deemed not material and therefore waivable by the public entity. Spina v. Borough of Fairview, 304 N.J. Super. 425, (App. Div. 1997).

As a matter of law, the Local Public Contract Law requires certain items to be included as material aspects of every bid. The statute reads:

"When required by the bid plans and specifications, the following requirements shall be considered mandatory items to be submitted at the time specified by the contracting unit for the receipt of the bids; the failure to submit any one of the mandatory items shall be deemed a fatal defect that shall render the bid proposal unresponsive and that cannot be cured by the governing body:

- a. A guarantee to accompany the bid pursuant to section 21 of P.L.1971, c.198 (C.40A:11-21);
- b. A certificate from a surety company pursuant to section 22 of P.L.1971, c.198 (C.40A:11-22);
- c. A statement of corporate ownership pursuant to section 1 of P.L.1977, c.33 (C.52:25-24.2);
- d. A listing of subcontractors pursuant to section 16 of P.L.1971, c.198 (C.40A:11-16);
- e. A document provided by the contracting agent in the bid plans, specifications, or bid proposal documents for the bidder to acknowledge the bidder's receipt of any notice or revisions or addenda to the advertisement or bid documents;"

N.J.S.A. 40A:11-23.2.

# RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING SHARED SERVICES AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CAPE MAY COUNTY MUNICIPAL UTILITIES AUTHORITY AND THE TOWNSHIP OF LOWER

WHEREAS, the Cape May County Municipal Utilities Authority ("CMCMUA" and/or "Authority") owns and operates a Class B/C Recycling Facility located within the Environmental Complex at 2050 Route 610, Woodbine, New Jersey 08270; and,

WHEREAS, as the implementing agency for solid waste management in Cape May County, the Authority accepts stumps, trunks, tree parts and used wood pallets from municipalities, residents and businesses of Cape May County and surrounding counties redirecting the disposal of these material from the Solid Waste Landfill, saving valuable air space for the disposal of non-recyclable materials; and,

WHEREAS, the Authority processes the accepted stumps, trunks, tree parts and used wood pallets through a tub grinder to produce wood mulch that is sold to landscapers, garden centers and residents of Cape May County; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Authority has purchased a new tub grinder to more efficiently and effectively process the accepted stumps, trunks, tree parts and used wood pallets; and,

WHEREAS, the Authority is awaiting the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) to issue a modification to the existing Title V Air Quality Permit (Air Permit Modification) which will authorize the operation of the newly purchased tub grinder; and,

**WHEREAS,** the Township of Lower ("Township") owns and operates a Class B Recycling Facility located at 2900 Bayshore Road, Villas, New Jersey, 08251 where the Township accepts stumps, trunks and tree parts from residents and businesses of the Township; and,

WHEREAS, the Township processes the accepted stumps, trunks and tree parts through a tub grinder, which is currently permitted by the NJDEP, to produce wood mulch that is provided to residents of the Township; and,

WHEREAS, the Township, at no cost to the Authority, has offered to provide a Township employed operator and permitted tub grinder to assist the Authority in the efficient and effective processing of accepted stumps, trunks, tree parts and used wood pallets at the Authority's Class B/C Recycling Facility while the Authority awaits receipt of the Air Permit Modification; and,

WHEREAS, the Authority has determined it to be in the best interest of its ratepayers to enter into an Agreement with the Township for the temporary use of the Township owned tub grinder and Township employed operator at the Authority's Class B/C Recycling Facility to facilitate the efficient and effective processing of accepted stumps, trunks, tree parts and used wood pallets.

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 et seq. authorizes local government units, including municipalities, counties and state agencies to enter into Agreements for the exchange of services pursuant to the provisions of the statute known as the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act ("Shared Services Act"); and,

**WHEREAS**, the Authority desires to memorialize each party's responsibilities in a Shared Services Agreement pursuant to the Shared Services Act; and,

WHEREAS, a Shared Services Agreement setting forth the terms and understandings related to the Agreement has been negotiated and prepared; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Authority's Staff has recommended the approval of said Shared Services Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Cape May County Municipal Utilities Authority, a body corporate and politic, as follows:

- 1. The WHEREAS clauses set forth above shall be incorporated herein as if set forth in full and made part of this Resolution.
- 2. The Cape May County Municipal Utilities Authority hereby approves the "SHARED SERVICES AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CAPE MAY COUNTY MUNICIPAL UTILITIES AUTHORITY AND THE TOWNSHIP OF LOWER", in substantially the same form as currently on file with the Authority's Office Manager, with such minor revisions as may be determined to be appropriate by the Authority's Executive Director and/or General Counsel.
- 3. The Executive Director, or Deputy Director, is hereby authorized and directed to execute said Agreement.

WHEREAS, P.L. 2007, c.311, et seq. provides for the awarding of Recycling Tax Fund Entitlements as Direct Recycling Grants to Counties by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection to designated solid waste management districts to assist them in the preparation, revision and implementation of comprehensive solid waste management and recycling plans; and,

- 2. That the CMCMUA does hereby hold the State of New Jersey, and its departments and agencies, harmless from any damages, losses and claims which may arise directly or indirectly from the execution of the Entitlement Program.
- 3. That the CMCMUA hereby accepts the terms and conditions set forth in the Recycling Enhancement Act and the guidelines promulgated under it.
- 4. That a revised Recycling Enhancement Act 2021 Spending Plan be submitted to the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection detailing the State of New Jersey's budget share of \$162,000.00 and the CMCMUA's budget share (Grantee Match) of \$68,607.60, for a Project Total of \$230,607.60.
- 5. That the Solid Waste Program Manager, or the Executive Director, of the CMCMUA is hereby authorized and directed to execute and file a revised Recycling Enhancement Act 2021 Spending Plan with the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, to provide additional information and furnish such documents as may be required, to execute such contracts as are required, and to act as the authorized correspondent of the CMCMUA.
