Construction Status Report - October 26, 2022 - Thomas J. LaRocco

<u>Sludge Transfer Facility Utility Consolidation</u> – The purpose of this contract is to consolidate and relocate those utilities at the Sludge Transfer Facility that will be required to maintain operations at the Facility during and after the future demolition of several structures at the Facility. Currently, this project is on "hold" pending a firm date that Atlantic City Electric can transfer power and energize the Electrical Control Building. Due to the disaster surrounding Hurricane Ian, Atlantic City Electric will be taking part in the relief efforts in Florida by sending crews to assist in restoring power. It is expected that Atlantic City Electric will resume with the new transformer installation and the transfer of power upon their return.

Solid Waste Transfer Facility Middle Bay Floor and Pushwall Rehabilitation - The purpose of this contract is to rehabilitate the Transfer Station's middle bay concrete floor and portions of the steel armored pushwall that have been worn and damaged due to daily use. This contract was awarded on August 3, 2022. Notice to Proceed was issued effective August 22, 2022. It is expected that the contract will begin physical work at the site on or about October 17, 2022. In the meantime, technical submittals have been reviewed.

1.0 General:

Operations Challenge:

During October 10, 2022 through October 12, 2022, several wastewater employees attended the 95th Annual Water Environment Federation's Technical Exhibition and Conference (WEFTEC). The conference is the largest annual water quality event in the world. Those who attended represented the New Jersey Water Environmental Association (NJWEA) and the Authority. With Authority employees serving in leadership roles with the NJWEA and/or were members of the Operations Challenge Team, all conference expenses were funded by the NJWEA.

The Authority has represented the NJWEA in the National Operations Challenge competition at WEFTEC for almost twenty (20) years. The competition consists of five (5) events and tests all of the skills of an operator. Most of all, the event promotes professional development, comradery and leadership. In the history of its participation, the Authority has seen dividends paid in the form of strong supervisors that were developed from the field personnel.

The NJWEA 2022 Operations Challenge Team "The Cakebreakers" consists of, from left to right, Eric Hansen, Arthur Cowan (coach/alternate), Kevin Barstow, Keith Wagner (team captain), and Emily Zidanic. The Cakebreakers finished in 10th place overall out of the 24 teams in Division II and a 2nd place trophy in the Collections Event. More importantly, they represented the Authority and the State of New Jersey with class and professionalism.


Pre-Reallocation:

The Authority adjusts the annual charges billed to each Participant for regional wastewater services in April of the succeeding fiscal year, based upon actual flow delivered from each community, and audited expenditures from the previous calendar year. While consistent with the Service Agreements executed with each Participant, the April adjustments are untimely for consideration in the municipal budget process. Considering this, the Authority also prepares a letter outlining a preliminary estimate of the adjustments and distributes these to the Participants in November of each year. This letter uses actual flow data from January through October and estimated flow data from November and December to redistribute the share of the user charges throughout the Participants based on their percentage of the total flow. The Authority issued this letter on November 15th, 2022 for the 2022 user charges.


Schneider Electric Training held for Electrical Committee

Schneider Electric representatives held an in-service training for the Plant Electricians and Project Crew Electricians at the Cape May Facility. The discussion centered on the use of the So-Move management program that allows field personnel to program all SMART technology from a laptop computer in the field or prior to equipment deployment. As part of the new

SCADA system, installations of all local electrical equipment can be monitored and controlled remotely. The Schneider representatives and the electricians programmed the newly installed RBC Smart buckets in Cape May. (See picture below and on following page.)

3.0 Projects:

3.1 Capital Improvement Projects

SCADA (Supervisory Control And Data Acquisition) - Seven Mile Region

Design Contract

Avanceon continues to work with the IT Department and Operational Staff to commission the new PLC controls and operator interface terminals throughout the system at the Seven Mile Beach/Middle Wastewater Treatment Facility.

Commissioning of the Seven Mile Region Pump Stations has continued during the month of October. This part of the commission has been very challenging. Communications interruptions caused by software code has been the issue at hand, but thanks to the diligent efforts of the Authority's OT and IT personnel, the issues are close to being resolved. Below are screenshot examples of how the Authority has been troubleshooting this issue using software that monitors radio communications as well as software that monitors ethernet traffic.





Construction Contract

Contract SM-04-21 Seven Mile Region Control System SCADA Upgrade continues with Scalfo Electric. Scalfo is essentially complete with the installation work at the Seven Mile Beach/Middle Wastewater Treatment Facility. Scalfo has completed the installation work at all of the small pump stations. Work continues at the 69th and 81st pump stations.

The estimated schedule has the work finishing in March of 2023.

Clarifier Gallery Overhaul at Wildwood/Lower

As part of the Wastewater Program's 20 year Capital Renewal and Replacement Plan, the clarifier gallery is being overhauled in order to provide operational efficiency in the control of primary and secondary sludge pumps. This project includes installing new VFDs, new valves, rebuilt pumps and rebuilt motors for both primary and secondary clarifiers. The mechanical and operation staff have identified the necessary valves for replacement and have placed material orders. Electrical staff have mounted six (6) new VFDs (three (3) for primary clarifiers and three (3) for secondary clarifiers) and have begun running control/power wiring. They have successfully operated the six (6) VFD installations using the new control system. The material to install an additional six (6) VFDs (three (3) for primary clarifiers and three (3) for secondary

clarifiers) has been ordered. Currently, the electrical equipment has not been delivered.

The mechanical materials have been delivered; however, due to the complexity of the valve system in the gallery, only a few valves can be replaced during the summer months. The larger project is planned for the off-season.

Replace Pumps, Motors, and Valving at Spicer Avenue Pump Station

As part of the Wastewater Program's 20 year Capital Renewal and Replacement Plan, this pump station was identified as requiring upgrades. Engineering was completed in-house and the pump station was redesigned to operate more efficiently. The re-design consists of two large pumps (each pump is capable of pumping peak summer flows) and two small pumps (each pump is capable of pumping peak winter flows) all on VFDs. The small pumps will provide pumping for approximately 90% of the year because even during the summer, they are capable of pumping during non-peak flow times. Being able to use the small pumps to this extent is a huge cost savings, as the small pumps are operated by a 40 horsepower (HP) motor while the large pumps are operated by a 125 horsepower motor. Cost savings are amplified further as the VFD allows the pump to operate at its peak performance even with variation in flows.

The pumps, motors, and valving at Spicer Avenue Pump Station are being replaced by the Project Crew. This project will be completed in two phases. The first phase does not require a bypass and is being completed prior to summer. The second phase requires a bypass and will be completed in the spring of 2023.


Currently, the Project Crew has installed and successfully completed startup for one of the small pumps (40 HP), motor, valving, and piping. One (1) of the two (2) new jib cranes has been installed which has an arm extending off the main body providing extra reach and easier lifting for maintenance of the newly installed pumps/motors/valves. The Project Crew completed the installation of the first 125 HP pump and it is completely commissioned and operational.

The installation of the two remaining pumps is currently on hold until January of 2023.

Air Release Chamber Evaluations and Air Release Replacements throughout the Authority's Force Main System

As part of the Wastewater Program's 20-Year Capital Renewal and Replacement Program, the replacement of air release chamber components that have either failed or reached their end of life are being replaced. Air Release Valves provide an important function to forcemains. An Air Release Valve allows air to escape a forcemain when water fills the pipe under higher pressure so air does not become entrapped and restrict the flow of water. When flows reduce to the point where there is air space in the pipe, the air release opens to allow air to fill the empty parts of the forcemain so a vacuum does not occur. If a vacuum were to occur, the forcemain could collapse or at least restrict the flow of the water in the forcemain.

An air release/collection system team has been developed to evaluate all of the air releases in the Authority. The team consists of staff from each plant and is being supervised by Ed Pisani, Wastewater Foreman, Cape May. The team is gathered once every 2-weeks and they evaluate air releases to determine which parts need to be replaced (air releases, valving, piping). Inspections from 81st Street Pump Station to Townsand's Inlet were completed on October 17th.



RBC and RBR Replacement Ocean City WWTP

As part of the Wastewater Program's 20-Year Capital Renewal and Replacement Program, the replacement of RBC media and shafts as well as the rehabilitation of the RBR shaft project began on September 23rd. Shafts have been removed from Bay 4. Disposal of the RBC shafts is being planned. The RBR shaft will undergo a complete rehab (sandblasting, painting and media replacement) prior to being returned to service. RBC/RBR replacement is scheduled for Bay 6 later this year. Catwalks in the RBC bays are also being replaced with new material.



Scum Concentrator Replacement at Seven Mile Beach/Middle and Wildwood/ Lower WTP

As part of the Wastewater Program's 20-Year Capital Renewal and Replacement Program, the Authority is replacing the Scum Concentrators at the Seven Mile Beach/Middle and the Wildwood/Lower WTFs. A scum concentrator combines dewatering by gravity separation with a heated day tank for further processing of concentrated scum and grease. This system provides the means to keep grease ladened skimmings pumpable to be transferred for disposal.

The Project Crew began demolition of the Seven Mile Beach/Middle scum concentrator system during the month of October. The Engineering department is developing a bid specification for contracting an equipment provider. In-House forces will conduct the installations at both locations. 3.2 Repair and Maintenance Projects

Wildwood/Lower Sludge Storage Tank Inspection and Cleaning

Operations staff perform an annual confined space entry into the sludge storage tanks. The work performed includes removing rags, grit and other debris from the tank and to inspect the equipment for unusual wear and tear. All the equipment passed the inspection, however spalling of the concrete was visible.

The Authority practices a robust breaker inspection program. Over the past two years all three (3) main bus breakers at the Wildwood/Lower WTF have been sent out to a certified testing company to be tested and refurbished. On October 11th, Atlantic City Electric was engaged to provide a temporary power disconnect to allow the electrician to install the newly refurbished breaker set. Currently all three breaker pairs are within inspection criteria and functional.






WWL main bus breaker installation

Load Banking Plant Generators

Annual load banking was conducted on the three (3) generators at the Wildwood/Lower Treatment Facility Plant, the two (2) generators at the Seven Mile Beach/Middle Treatment Facility, and the two (2) generators at the Ocean City Treatment Facility. Load bank testing is a maintenance practice that puts a generator under varying load conditions and evaluates how the generator reacts to the power draw.

The load banking consists of a step load test and a dump test. The step load test is for a half an hour (30 min) at various dynamic loads ranging from 0% to 80% of its rated capacity, typically 15%, 30%, 50% and 80%. Loads are gradually applied from one step to the next until the generator reaches its capacity. The dump load test is to observe how the generator reacts to larger loads applied from its idle position at 50% and 80% for one (1) hour. (See pictures below and on the following pages.)





Ocean City docking station for emergency generator and load bank connections




Trailer Mounted Load Banking Setup OC







I. INTRODUCTION

I have reviewed the documents provided regarding the bid submissions with respect to Contract OC-18-22 for the Ocean City Region – 32nd Street Pump Station Piping and Pump Upgrades project on behalf of the Cape May County Municipal Utilities Authority ("CMCMUA" and/or "Authority"). The CMCMUA received three (3) bids for the Contract. The bids were submitted on Tuesday, November 1, 2022 at 2:00 p.m. as follows:

II. <u>FACTUAL ANALYSIS</u>

This project sought bids for the provision of administrative and scheduling personnel as well as providing all the labor, superintendence, materials, construction facilities, tools and equipment necessary and required for properly performing all work required under the specifications, which includes popping and pump upgrades of the 32nd Street Pump Station. See Bid Specifications Section 010100, Technical Specifications, Summary of Work.

RE: Ocean City Region – 32nd Street Pump Station Piping and Pump Upgrades OC-18-22

The apparent low bidder for the above referenced contract was Municipal Maintenance Co. ("Municipal Maintenance"). Upon review of the bid submitted by Municipal Maintenance, it was uncovered that the bidder did not submit Insurance Information within their original bid package. Additionally, it was uncovered that the Consent of Surety submitted within the bid was not executed by the surety company. While the Consent of Surety is notarized, it is not executed by a representative from The Ohio Casualty Insurance Company. The bid specifications do clearly require the submission of a Consent of Surety form within the bid.

The second apparent low bidder for the above referenced contract was Allied Construction Group, Inc. ("Allied"). Following my review of the bid submitted by Allied, the bid complies with the specifications from a legal perspective and no apparent defects are present.

III. LEGAL ANALYSIS

The Local Public Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1 et seq. regulates bidding on Contracts of public entities in New Jersey. In general, the practice of public bidding is universally recognized and deeply imbedded in the public policy of the State of New Jersey. N.E.R.I. Corp. v. New Jersey Highway Authority, 147 N.J. 223, 236 (1996). There is a prima facie presumption that power and discretion of governmental action in awarding bids on public Contracts has been properly exercised. Colonnelli Bros., Inc. v. Village of Ridgefield Park, 284 N.J.Super. 538, 541 (App.Div.1995).

Public bidding statutes are to be construed with sole reference to the public good and rigidly adhered to by courts. Hall Const. Co., Inc. v. New Jersey Sports & Exposition Authority, 295 N.J.Super. 629, 634 (App.Div.1996). Furthermore, public bidding statutes exist for the good of taxpayers, not bidders, and they must always be construed for the public good and to guard against favoritism, improvidence, extravagance, and corruption. Sevell v. New Jersey Highway Authority, 329 N.J.Super. 580, 584 (App.Div.2000).

Every Contract awarded by the contracting agent for the provision or performance of any goods or services, the cost of which in the aggregate exceeds the bid threshold, shall be awarded only by Resolution of the governing body of the contracting unit to the lowest responsible bidder after public advertising for bids and bidding therefore. N.J.S.A. 40A:11-4. "Lowest responsible bidder or vendor" means the bidder or vendor: (a) whose response to a request for bids offers the lowest price and is responsive; and (b) who is responsible. N.J.S.A. 40A:11-2. The lowest responsible bidder on a public Contract must not only be deemed responsible but must submit the lowest bid which conforms to the Contract specifications. Matter of Protest of Award of On-Line Games Production & Operation Services Contract, Bid No. 95-X-20175, 279 N.J.Super. 566, 590 (App.Div.1995).

It is firmly established in New Jersey that material conditions contained in bidding specifications may not be waived. <u>Terminal Const. Corp. v. Atlantic Cty. Sewerage Auth.</u>, 67 N.J. 403, 409 (1975). A contracting body is generally without discretion to accept a defective bid. <u>Meadowbrook Carting Co. v. Borough of Island Heights</u>, 138 N.J. 307, 314 (1994). However, while material conditions contained in bidding specifications may not be waived, this rule does not apply to minor or inconsequential conditions. Public contracting units may resolve problems arising from such conditions in a sensible or practical way.

<u>Terminal Const. Corp.</u>, 67 N.J. at 409-11. Materiality of a particular specification is to be determined as a matter of law. <u>Hanover Tp. v. Inter. Fidelity Ins. Co.</u>, 122 <u>N.J.Super.</u> 544, 548 (App.Div.1973).

There are two (2) criteria for determining whether a specific non-compliance constitutes a substantial and, hence, non-waivable irregularity: (1) Whether the effect of a waiver would be to deprive the public body of its assurance that the Contract will be entered into, performed, and guaranteed according to its specific requirements; and (2) Whether it is of such a nature that its waiver would adversely affect competitive bidding by placing a bidder in a position of advantage over the other bidders or by otherwise undermining the necessary common standard of competition. Township of River Vale v. R.J. Longo Constr. Co., 127 N.J.Super. 207, 222 (Law.Div.1974).

The court has provided further guidance as to materiality where an error is "patent and the true intent of the bidder obvious". In such a situation, the Appellate Division has held that such an error may be disregarded by the public agency. The Court held that certain non-compliance (i.e. obvious error) with the bid specifications may be deemed not material and therefore waivable by the public entity. Spina v. Borough of Fairview, 304 N.J. Super. 425, (App. Div. 1997).

As a matter of law, the Local Public Contract Law requires certain items to be included as material aspects of every bid. The statute reads:

"When required by the bid plans and specifications, the following requirements shall be considered mandatory items to be submitted at the time specified by the contracting unit for the receipt of the bids; the failure to submit any one of the mandatory items shall be deemed a fatal defect that shall render the bid proposal unresponsive and that cannot be cured by the governing body:

- a. A guarantee to accompany the bid pursuant to section 21 of P.L.1971, c. 198 (C.40A:11-21);
- b. A certificate from a surety company pursuant to section 22 of P.L.1971, c. 198 (C.40A:11-22);
- c. A statement of corporate ownership pursuant to section 1 of P.L.1977, c. 33 (C.52:25-24.2);
- d. A listing of subcontractors pursuant to section 16 of P.L.1971, c. 198 (C.40A:11-16);
- e. A document provided by the contracting agent in the bid plans, specifications, or bid proposal documents for the bidder to acknowledge the bidder's receipt of any notice or revisions or addenda to the advertisement or bid documents."

N.J.S.A. 40A:11-23.2 (emphasis added).

Finally, a local contracting unit is permitted to reject all bids within a part under certain conditions. N.J.S.A. 40A:11-13.2, provides as follows:

- "A contracting unit may reject all bids for any of the following reasons:
- a. The lowest bid substantially exceeds the cost estimates for the goods or services;
- b. The lowest bid substantially exceeds the contracting unit's appropriation for the goods or services;
- c. The governing body of the contracting unit decides to abandon the project for provision or performance of the goods or services;
- d. The contracting unit wants to substantially revise the specifications for the goods or services;
- e. The purposes or provisions or both of P.L.1971, c. 198 (C.40A:11-1 et seq.) are being violated;
- f. The governing body of the contracting unit decides to use the State authorized contract pursuant to section 12 of P.L.1971, c. 198 (C.40A:11-12)."

N.J.S.A. 40A:11-13.2.

Upon review of the apparent low bid submitted by Municipal Maintenance, it was uncovered that the Consent of Surety submitted within the bid was not executed by the surety company. The Consent of Surety is notarized, however it is not executed by a representative from The Ohio Casualty Insurance Company. The bid specifications explicitly do require a Consent of Surety to be provided. The specifications read as follows:

"The Bidder shall submit with the Bid a Consent of Surety with Power of Attorney for the full amount of the Bid price from a Surety Company authorized to do business in the State of New Jersey and acceptable to the OWNER stating that it will provide the Bidder with a Performance Bond AND Payment Bond in the full amount of the Bid. This Consent of Surety shall be obtained in order to confirm that the Bidder to whom the Contract is awarded will furnish a Performance Bond AND Payment Bond from an acceptable Surety Company on behalf of the Bidder, any or all Subcontractors or by each respective Subcontractor or by any combination thereof which results in performance security equal to the total amount of the Contract, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:11-22."

See Bid Specifications 00200-5 (15.7), General Instructions to Bidders.

RE: Ocean City Region – 32nd Street Pump Station Piping and Pump Upgrades OC-18-22

As outlined above, New Jersey law is clear that the failure to provide a signed Consent of Surety is a fatal, material defect. See N.J.S.A. 40A:11-23.2(b). Further, this material defect cannot be remedied or cured once bids are received and opened by the Authority. Meadowbrook Carting Co., 138 N.J. 307. As such, the Authority is left with no alternative but to reject the bid submitted by Municipal Maintenance as non-responsive due to their failure to provide a fully executed Consent of Surety within their original bid package.

Following the rejection of the bid submitted by Municipal Maintenance as non-responsive, the apparent low bidder is Allied. Upon review, there are no apparent defects within the bid submitted by Allied. To the extent a defect may be uncovered, it is my legal opinion that any such defect is minor in nature and may be waived by the Authority pursuant to the Court's holdings in <u>River Vale</u> and <u>Spina</u>.

The bid submitted by Allied is in the appropriate form.

V. CONCLUSION

After researching the applicable law, reviewing the Contract specifications and documents, and conferring with staff, it is my legal opinion that the bid submitted by Municipal Maintenance must be rejected as non-responsive due to their failure to submit a properly executed Consent of Surety within their original bid package. It is my further legal opinion that the Contract for OC-18-22 for the Ocean City Region – 32nd Street Pump Station Piping and Pump Upgrades project on behalf of the CMCMUA be awarded to Allied. It is therefore recommended that a Resolution be placed on the Agenda for an upcoming meeting rejecting the bid submitted by Municipal Maintenance as non-responsive and awarding said Contract to Allied subject to staff concurrence and the availability of funds.

WHEREAS, the Cape May County Municipal Utilities Authority ("CMCMUA"/"Authority") constructed, circa 1985, a twenty-four inch (24") diameter ductile iron pipe (DIP) force main on Delaware Avenue in North Wildwood from 10th Avenue to 26th Avenue ("Force Main") for the purpose of conveying wastewater from the CMCMUA's 10th Avenue Pump Station to the CMCMUA's Wildwood/Lower Region Wastewater Facility; and,

WHEREAS, both the City of North Wildwood and the CMCMUA agree that to ameliorate the current and future discharge of groundwater onto Delaware Avenue resulting from previously completed Authority projects on the Force Main, the best course of action is to install an underdrain system along the west side of Delaware Avenue; and,

WHEREAS, the City of North Wildwood retains a miscellaneous service contractor that is equipped and experienced with work related to roadway drainage and drainage structures; and,

WHEREAS, the City retains an engineering firm that is knowledgeable and experienced with similar groundwater flow situations; and,

WHEREAS, the City of North Wildwood and the CMCMUA deem it to be in their interests and desire to enter into an agreement, "Agreement Between the Cape May County Municipal Utilities Authority and the City of North Wildwood for the Construction of an Underdrain System on Delaware Avenue" ("Agreement"), that clearly sets forth the responsibilities of each party; and,

WHEREAS, the CMCMUA's General Counsel has reviewed the Agreement and has opined that it is in the appropriate form and upon execution will be enforceable according to its terms; and,

WHEREAS, the CMCMUA's Chief Engineer and Executive Director has recommended approval of said Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Cape May County Municipal Utilities Authority, a body corporate and politic, as follows:

- 1. The provisions of the WHEREAS clauses set forth above are herein incorporated by reference and made a part hereof.
- 2. The Cape May County Municipal Utilities Authority hereby approves the Agreement, "Agreement Between the Cape May County Municipal Utilities Authority and the City of North Wildwood for the Construction of an Underdrain System on Delaware Avenue", in substantially the same form as currently on file with the Authority's Office Manager, with such minor revisions as may be determined to be appropriate by the Authority's Executive Director and/or General Counsel.

3. The Executive Director, or Deputy Director, is hereby authorized and directed to execute said Agreement.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CAPE MAY COUNTY MUNICIPAL UTILITIES AUTHORITY AND THE CITY OF NORTH WILDWOOD FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF AN UNDERDRAIN SYSTEM ON DELAWARE AVENUE

THIS AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is made as of thisday of
2022 ("Effective Date"), by and between the Cape May County Municipal Utilities Authority
(the "CMCMUA" and/or "Authority"), a body corporate and politic duly organized under the laws
of the State of New Jersey with principal offices located at 1523 U.S. Route 9 North, Cape
May Court House, NJ 08210 and the City of North Wildwood (the "City" and/or "North
Wildwood"), a municipal corporate body politic, with principal offices located at 901 Atlantic
Avenue, North Wildwood, New Jersey 08260 (each a "Party" and collectively, the "Parties").

RECITALS:

WHEREAS, the CMCMUA was created in 1972 by the Cape May County Board of County Commissioners (formerly named the Board of Chosen Freeholders) to implement a comprehensive regional program for wastewater collection and treatment in Cape May County; and,

WHEREAS, the regional program consists of four separate service regions, the Ocean City Region, Seven Mile Beach/Middle Region, Wildwood/Lower Region, and Cape May Region, each with its own system of pumping stations, force mains, and wastewater treatment facilities ("Regional System"); and,

WHEREAS, North Wildwood was incorporated as a City by an act of the New Jersey Legislature on or about April 30, 1917 and is a City form of government with the enabling authority to take all necessary action to preserve and enforce the general welfare, order and security of the municipality; and,

WHEREAS, the Parties entered into a Wastewater Service Agreement dated June 28, 1979, as amended from time to time, for the collection and treatment of sewage on a regional basis, wherein each Participant owns and maintains a wastewater collection system and delivers sewage to the Regional System for treatment and disposal; and,

WHEREAS, the CMCMUA constructed, circa 1985, a twenty-four inch (24") diameter ductile iron pipe (DIP) force main on Delaware Avenue in North Wildwood from 10th Avenue to 26th Avenue ("Force Main") for the purpose of conveying wastewater from the CMCMUA's 10th Avenue Pump Station to the CMCMUA's Wildwood/Lower Region Wastewater Facility; and,

WHEREAS, both the City and the CMCMUA agree that to ameliorate the current and future discharge of groundwater onto Delaware Avenue resulting from previously completed Authority projects on the Force Main, the best course of action is to install an underdrain system along the west side of Delaware Avenue; and,

WHEREAS, the City retains a miscellaneous service contractor that is equipped and experienced with work related to roadway drainage and drainage structures; and,

WHEREAS, the City retains an engineering firm that is knowledgeable and experienced with similar groundwater flow situations; and,

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the above recitals and the mutual promises and covenants set forth hereinafter, the sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, and with the intent to be legally bound, the Parties do hereby agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Recitals</u>: The foregoing recitals are hereby incorporated by reference and made a part hereof, as if set forth fully herein.
- 2. The underdrain system shall consist, generally, of a perforated HDPE pipe, surrounded by porous stone media and filter fabric, and shall be sloped from north to south for an approximate length of one-hundred feet (100') along the west side of Delaware Avenue. The drainage pipe shall discharge into an existing storm drainage inlet located at the northwest corner of the 14th Avenue and Delaware Avenue intersection. The underdrain system shall have an invert depth approximately one (1) to three (3) feet below the top of the existing pavement, and shall include backfilling and temporary pavement restoration (as defined by North Wildwood Municipal Code 382-19.9.C.(2).a.)
- The cost of the underdrain system shall be \$30,682.26.
- City Responsibilities:
 - (a) The City shall be responsible for the design, engineering and construction management of the underdrain system work.
 - (b) The City shall be responsible for procuring the contractor to construct the underdrain system and make all payments owed to the contractor.
 - (c) The City shall be responsible for procuring all federal, state, county and municipal permits and approvals associated with the work, and for coordinating and communicating with all regulatory agencies during construction of the underdrain system.
 - (d) The City shall not charge the CMCMUA for the costs of all Road Opening Permit

- fees and inspection fees associated with the construction of the underdrain system and/or for final pavement restoration.
- (e) The City shall be solely responsible for public safety, and for all traffic and pedestrian control during construction of the underdrain system.
- (f) The City shall be responsible for restoring all disturbed grounds and structures upon completion of the construction of the underdrain system.
- (g) The City shall assume all ownership, jurisdiction and control of the underdrain system and shall be responsible for the operations and maintenance of the underdrain system through perpetuity.
- (h) The City shall submit the CMCMUA a written invoice for costs incurred to construct the underdrain system.

CMCMUA Responsibilities:

- (a) The CMCMUA shall be responsible for reimbursing the City for the costs incurred for the engineering and construction of the underdrain system. Costs for such work shall be clearly delineated by a written invoice from the City. The CMCMUA will, in turn, reimburse the City for such costs based upon an invoice received by the CMCMUA from the City. The City's invoice to the CMCMUA shall be a direct reimbursement, with no markup, of the City's payment to the contractor and the City's engineering firm. Reimbursement to the City shall be made within one hundred and eighty (180) calendar days of either the CMCMUA's receipt of the invoice from the City, the completion of the underdrain system, or the execution of this Agreement, whichever is later.
- (b) Though not considered part of the underdrain system, the CMCMUA shall be responsible for the completion of final pavement restoration through the CMCMUA's ongoing Contract WW-04-22, at no cost to the City, in accordance with the North Wildwood Municipal Code 382-19.9.C.(3).(b). The width of the final pavement restoration shall be limited to approximately six feet (6') above the underdrain system.
- 6. Notice: All notices required or permitted under this Agreement shall be in writing signed by the Party serving the same and shall be served on the other Party by postage prepaid certified or registered mail, return receipt requested, by a nationally recognized overnight express delivery service that obtains delivery receipts (e.g., FEDEX), or by facsimile transmission with confirmation of receipt and addressed as follows, or to such

other address for which a Party provided notice of change of address pursuant hereto: If to CMCMUA:

Notices shall be effective when received at the address specified above. Changes in the respective addresses or individual to which such notice should be directed may be made from time to time, by any Party, by written notice to the other Parties.

- 7. <u>Term</u>: The term of this Agreement shall commence on the Effective Date. The obligations of jurisdictional control and maintenance by the City, as outlined herein, shall exist through perpetuity.
- 8. <u>Counterparts</u>: This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original document, and all of which together shall be deemed but one and the same agreement.
- 9. Effective Date: This Agreement shall be executed and delivered first by the CMCMUA and then by the City after due authorization and approval. The Effective Date shall be the date all parties have executed this Agreement as authorized by proper Resolution or Ordinance, as may be required.
- 10. <u>Due Authorization</u>: By signing below, each Party represents to the others that it has been

authorized by all necessary action, resolution or otherwise to execute and deliver this Agreement, and that the person signing on behalf of each Party has been duly authorized to do so and that by doing so, binds such Party hereto. A copy of the City's and the CMCMUA's authorizing resolutions are attached as Exhibit "A".

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, and intending to be legally bound, the Parties have executed this Agreement by their duly authorized representatives as of the Effective Date.

WHEREAS, the Authority, pursuant to its Resolution No. 8-21, authorized Marex Spectron, located at (http://www.marexspectron.com/), a vendor approved by the State of New Jersey, Department of Community Affairs, Division of Local Government Services for the provision of online auction services to market and sell all the RECs generated at the Authority's Sanitary Landfill site at a fixed price for the period of June 1, 2021 through May 31, 2023; and,

WHEREAS, DTE Energy Trading, Inc., submitted the highest bid of \$11.77 per REC for the purchase of all RECs, during the February 4, 2021 online auction, to be generated during the stated time period; and,

WHEREAS, an Agreement for the sale of RECs was executed by the Authority and DTE Energy Trading, Inc., pursuant to Resolution 8-21; and,

WHEREAS, the Authority has generated 32 RECs in October 2022 from the electrical generators and 6 RECs from the parasitic electric usage for a total of 38 RECs currently available for sale.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Cape May County Municipal Utilities Authority, a body corporate and politic, as follows:

- 1. The provisions of the WHEREAS clauses set forth above are herein incorporated by reference and made a part hereof.
- The CMCMUA is hereby authorized to sell 38 Renewable Energy Certificates generated at its Sanitary Landfill site to DTE Energy Trading, Inc.

On February 4, 2021, Marex Spectron, on behalf of the Authority, auctioned Renewable Energy Certificates (RECs) for future generation from June 1, 2021 through May 31, 2023 which will be generated from the three (3) active electrical generators. All RECs were sold for \$11.77 each as:

NJ Class I REC 2022 Vintage: 10,000 firm/2,500 contingent NJ Class I REC 2023 Vintage: 10,000 firm/2,500 contingent

103 RECs were sold for the month of September 2022.

As a continuation of our previous approval process, authorization is requested to sell the current October 2022 RECs totaling 32 RECs as well as 6 RECs generated from the parasitic electric usage all at the \$11.77/REC pricing. Each month, staff will continue to put forward an authorization request as new RECs become available for sale by PJM.

Therefore, approval of a resolution to sell 38 RECs is requested for the next Regular Board Meeting.
